MASS INTENTIONS (\$10.00)

The Church considers the Mass the greatest possible prayer of intercession because it is the perfect offering of Christ to the Father by making present the Paschal Mystery of His death and resurrection.

It is a longstanding tradition in the Church that a Priest may be requested to offer a Mass for a specific intention, even when one cannot be physically present at the Mass.

The faithful make a free will offering, called a stipend, to a priest or Religious Community in order to apply the Mass to a specific intention. By making this offering, the faithful, by making their own offering, associate themselves more intimately with Christ who offers Himself in the Sacred Host, and thereby obtain more abundant fruits (refer to Pope Paul VI's letter "Firma in Traditione" (Firm in Tradition) of June 13, 1974).

From July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 the weekly need is \$3,977.00. This does not include Religious Education, Youth Ministry personnel, which could account for \$16,000 or more, nor does it include the Capital Campaign. However, we are able to keep up financially because of your added contributions to the Fall Festival, Chili Feed and Christmas Bazaar fundraisers. Thank you to all who contribute.

Divine Worship

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook Chapter 1A Section 1.1.2 states: *“The celebration of the Mass is the action of Christ and the People of God arrayed hierarchically. It is the center of the whole Christian Life for the Church both universal and local, as well as for each of the faithful individually. In it is found the high point both of the action by which God sanctifies the world in Christ and of the worship that the human race offers to the Father, adoring him through Christ, the Son of God, in the Holy Spirit. In it, moreover, during the course of the year, the mysteries of redemption are recalled so as in some way to be made present. Furthermore, the other sacred actions and all the activities of the Christian life are bound up with it, flow from it, and are ordered to it.”*⁵

Section 1.1.3 states: *“It is therefore of the greatest importance that the celebration of Holy Mass be so arranged that the sacred ministers and the faithful taking part in it, according to the proper state of each, may derive from it more abundantly those fruits for the sake of which Christ the Lord instituted the Eucharistic sacrifice of his Body and Blood and entrusted it to the Church, his beloved Bride, as the memorial of his Passion and Resurrection.”*⁶
