MASS INTENTIONS (\$10.00)

The Church considers the Mass the greatest possible prayer of intercession because it is the perfect offering of Christ to the Father by making present the Paschal Mystery of His death and resurrection.

It is a longstanding tradition in the Church that a Priest may be requested to offer a Mass for a specific intention, even when one cannot be physically present at the Mass.

The faithful make a free will offering, called a stipend, to a priest or Religious Community in order to apply the Mass to a specific intention. By making this offering, the faithful, by making their own offering, associate themselves more intimately with Christ who offers Himself in the Sacred Host, and thereby obtain more abundant fruits (refer to Pope Paul VI's letter "Firma in Traditione" (Firm in Tradition) of June 13, 1974).

From July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 the weekly need is \$3,977.00. This does not include Religious Education, Youth Ministry personnel, which could account for \$16,000 or more, nor does it include the Capital Campaign. However, we are able to keep up financially because of your added contributions to the Fall Festival, Chili Feed and Christmas Bazaar fundraisers. Thank you to all who contribute.

Divine Worship

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook Chapter 1A Section 1.1.4 states: *“Among all celebrations of the Holy Eucharist, two occasions are of particular importance: a Mass at which the Archbishop presides and the community Sunday Mass.”*

The Archbishop of Portland in Oregon

Section 1.2.1: *“Among all celebrations of the Holy Eucharist, first place should certainly be given, because of its significance, to the celebration of Holy Mass at which the Archbishop personally presides, either as principal celebrant of the Liturgy of the Eucharist or, when in certain circumstances he chooses to preside over the Liturgy of the Word, while delegating a priest to celebrate the Eucharistic Prayer in his presence.⁷ On that occasion is he surrounded by his priests and deacons and in a celebration where the holy people of God participate fully and actively, for it is there that the predominant expression of the Church is found.⁸ (See Chapter 2)”*

Section 1.2.2: *“However, every legitimate celebration of the Eucharist in the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon without exception is directed by the Archbishop, either in person or through priests who are his helpers.⁹”*
