MASS INTENTIONS (\$10.00 stipend)

Q: Do I need to request a Mass intention or can I offer up the Mass I attend for these needs?

A: Any Catholic may offer up the Mass in which he or she attends for any good intention. Certainly, graces will accrue in accordance with the intensity of that person's participation and sincerity.

However, the custom of requesting a priest to offer the Mass for a specific intention, even when one cannot be physically present at the Mass, is a longstanding tradition in the Church. This is because the Church considers the Mass as the greatest possible prayer of intercession insofar as it is the perfect offering of Christ to the Father by making present the paschal mystery of his death and resurrection.

Because of the particular role of the priest as mediator between God and man, acting "in persona Christi" when offering the holy sacrifice of the Mass, it is usually considered that special graces may be obtained when he applies the Mass to a particular intention.

From July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 the weekly need is \$3,977.00. This does not include Religious Education, Youth Ministry personnel, which could account for \$16,000 or more, nor does it include the Capital Campaign. However, we are able to keep up financially because of your added contributions to the Fall Festival, Chili Feed and Christmas Bazaar fundraisers. Thank you to all who contribute.

Divine Worship

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook Chapter 1C states:

The Faithful People

Section 1.10.1: "Fully conscious and active participation in liturgical celebrations by the faithful is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy, as the primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian spirit. It is a major objective in all pastoral work and in the preparation of each particular liturgical celebration."³⁶

Section 1.10.2: "Nevertheless, from the fact that the liturgical celebration obviously entails activity, it does not follow that everyone must necessarily have something concrete 'to do' beyond the common actions and gestures, as if a certain specific liturgical service must necessarily be given to the individuals to be carried out by them. Instead, diligent efforts should be made to correct superficial notions and to instill anew in all of Christ's faithful that sense of deep wonder before the greatness of the mystery of faith that is the Eucharist."³⁷
