Divine Worship

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook Chapter 1C states:

Section 1.12.3: "If, however, the tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament is present anywhere in the sanctuary, the priest, the deacon, and the other ministers genuflect when they approach the altar and when they depart from it, but not during the celebration of Mass itself.

Otherwise all who pass before the Blessed Sacrament genuflect, unless they are moving in procession. Ministers carrying the processional cross or candles bow their heads instead of genuflecting."⁴⁵

Section 1.12.4: "A bow signifies reverence and honor shown to the persons themselves or to the signs that represent them. There are two kinds of bows: a bow of the head and a bow of the body: "

a. A bow of the head is made when the three Divine Persons are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated. In the United States a reverent bow of the head is suggested before receiving Holy Communion.⁴⁶

b. A bow of the body, that is to say a profound bow, is made to the altar during the prayers *Munda cor meum* (*Cleanse my heart*) and *In spiritu humilitatis* (*With humble spirit*); in the Creed at the words *Et incarnatus est* (*and by the Holy Spirit... and became man*); in the Roman Canon at the words *Supplices te rogamus* (*In humble prayer we ask you, almighty God*). The same kind of bow is made by the deacon when he asks for a blessing before the proclamation of the Gospel. In addition, the priest bows slightly as he speaks the words of the Lord at the Consecration.⁴⁷

MASS INTENTIONS (\$10.00 stipend)

Q: The priest simultaneously said a Mass intention for the intention for which I gave a stipend and an intention for vocations. Is this allowed?

A: This is allowed. He may celebrate a regularly scheduled parish Mass for which a parishioner has provided an intention⁶ (and a stipend), but at the same time he may perhaps have in mind the intention of his elderly mother. In fact, he may have as many intentions as he likes while offering a Mass, so long as he has accepted a stipend for no more than one of them. While on the surface this may seem illogical, keep in mind that the spiritual value of a single Mass is infinite. The intention for which a stipend was offered is not somehow giving short-shrift if the celebrant offers that same Mass for other intentions as well.

As a rule, a priest may only offer one Mass per day, although there are occasions when he may be permitted to offer more than one Mass in a single day ([canon 905.1](#)). (This is why, when St. Frederic has a funeral scheduled, daily Mass is cancelled for the day. Anyone who wants to go to Mass that day is able to attend the funeral.) On Sundays and Holy Days, for example, a priest may celebrate as many as three Masses in one day (and possibly more in areas with a shortage of priests).
