Divine Worship

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook (ALH)
Chapter 1C states:

Other Gestures

Section 1.13.1: "During the Penitential Act, if the Confiteor is used, the faithful strike their breast three times at the words 'my fault...my fault....my most grievous fault'."⁴⁵

Section 1.13.2: "At the Gospel when the priest or deacon announces the reading it is customary for the faithful to make a sign of the cross on their forehead, lips and breast."

Additional Gestures and Postures

Section 1.14.1: "Unless approved for the Universal Church by the Holy See or for the local Church by the competent Bishop's Conference, other gestures and postures cannot be admitted to the Sacred Liturgy. Liturgical law is prescriptive in nature and therefore the absence of a prohibition does not allow for innovation."

Silence

Section 1.15.1: "God is manifest both in the beauty of liturgical singing and in the power of silence. The Sacred Liturgy has its rhythm of texts, actions, chants, and silence. Silence in the liturgy allows the community to reflect on what it has heard and experienced, and to open its heart to the mystery celebrated. Ministers and pastoral musicians should take care that the rites unfold with the proper ebb and flow of sound and silence. The importance of silence in the liturgy cannot be overemphasized."⁴⁸

Section 1.15.2: "Sacred silence, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times. Its purpose, however, depends on the time it occurs in each part of the celebration. Thus within the Penitential Act and again after the invitation to pray, all recollect themselves; but at the conclusion of a reading or the homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise and pray to God in their hearts."⁴⁹

MASS INTENTIONS (\$10.00 stipend)

Q: The priest simultaneously said a Mass intention for the intention for which I gave a stipend and an intention for vocations. Is this allowed?

A: This is allowed. He may celebrate a regularly scheduled parish Mass for which a parishioner has provided an intention (and a stipend), but at the same time he may perhaps have in mind the intention of his elderly mother. In fact, he may have as many intentions as he likes while offering a Mass, so long as he has accepted a stipend for no more than one of them. While on the surface this may seem illogical, keep in mind that the spiritual value of a single Mass is infinite. The intention for which a stipend was offered is not somehow giving short-shrift if the celebrant offers that same Mass for other intentions as well.

As a rule, a priest may only offer one Mass per day, although there are occasions when he may be permitted to offer more than one Mass in a single day ([canon 905.1](#)). (This is why, when St. Frederic has a funeral scheduled, daily Mass is cancelled for the day. Anyone who wants to go to Mass that day is able to attend the funeral.) On Sundays and Holy Days, for example, a priest may celebrate as many as three Masses in one day (and possibly more in areas with a shortage of priests).
