

Of Many Things

Today's Liturgy: The Promise of and Coming of the Spirit

On this Sixth Sunday of Easter, the liturgy focuses on the promise and coming of the Holy Spirit. In the first reading, Philip goes to a city of Samaria and proclaims the gospel. When the apostles in Jerusalem hear this, they send Peter and John to lay hands on the Samaritans so that they might receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Samaritans were outsiders and outcasts. That they accepted the gospel and then received the gift of the Holy Spirit shows that God is doing something new in the risen Christ. God is always doing something new in our lives as well!

In the second reading St. Peter encourages us to sanctify Christ in our hearts by honoring and revering him as the Lord and Savior of our lives. We honor and revere Christ as our Lord and Savior because he is the one whom God raised from the dead through the power of the Holy Spirit so that we might enter new life. Make Christ the Lord of your life and the Spirit will dwell in you!

In today's gospel, Jesus promises us an Advocate who will intercede for us before God. This Advocate is the Holy Spirit who lives in our hearts and abides with the Church forever. This Spirit prays for us and advocates our cause before God.

Ascension Thursday

This Thursday, May 25th is Ascension Thursday. On this day, forty days after Easter, the risen Christ returned to the Father who sent him into the world. Having returned to the Father, the risen Christ is now enthroned at the right hand of God where he prays and intercedes for us. Please join us on this beautiful feast in which we celebrate the victory of Christ over the powers of Sin and Death.

Masses will be celebrated at 8:00 AM, 12:15 PM, and 6:00 PM.
