

HOW TO MAKE A CARNIVAL

Over the course of our four- day carnival we are grateful for the massive effort and generous time-giving of so many volunteers and parishioners.

In addition to the months of preparation preceding the event; during the 4 days we operated fourteen game booths plus two ticket booths that required our human resource department to find 28 volunteers per shift; 2 shifts per night; 56 volunteers per night. That would have been 224 for the four days if there weren't last minute cancellations that we had to work around - 896 total hours. Not to mention the thankless parking management, the great 50/50 crew, the enormous effort of the Haiti committee and the many volunteers to set up the white elephant sale. Filing the permits for the games, 50/50's, health, building and fire permits. Soliciting sponsorships for games and rides.

Our finance department and counting crew not only counted the monies but had to provide "starter money" and constantly pick up the monies from all the games, ticket booths, kitchen and 50/50 stations.

The kitchen crew required 10-15

volunteers per night that we saw. What you didn't see was the food prep---ordering and picking up all those burgers, dogs, pizzas, fries, chicken strips, onion rings, rolls, corn on the cob, and making 20 lbs. of sausage and peppers, slicing tomatoes and lettuce and onions, making meatballs, picking up 75 cases of soda and 40 cases water and picking up 800 pounds of ice; taking away the garbage each night; health, plumbing, fire and building inspections.

And...

Just when you thought it was over, Sunday comes--clearing out and disposing of EVERYTHING not sold at the white elephant sale taking down the tents, lights and power cords, cleaning out the deep fryer and grills emptying the garbage cans and putting everything back into storage.

And yet it was all worth it for the community spirit the camaraderie and hopefully some profit for the parish.

....and we will do it again I'm sure.

LITURGY

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14c

Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. The people will better understand God's power through their homeland's restoration.

Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18

Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to his ideals is what matters most.

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach his good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
July 3, 2016

"At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them 'The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few, so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest'... 'May I never boast except in the cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ.'"

A rich tradition as missionaries were taking leave for their travels to other lands, was the presentation of their mission cross. How often when missionaries visited parishes to preach a mission, they carried that cross with them, and with it, blessed the people.

It is not rare for us to observe on our streets young Mormons or Jehovah Witnesses, going in pairs to bring their message, stopping, conversing, knocking at doors. Jesus did the same when he sent the seventy-two.

Pope Francis has reminded us of our mission, to hit the road, dirty our feet, yes, and even be bruised as we become His laborers for His harvest. We are not to wait in church for others to join us in the gift of our faith, but we too are sent, apostles, to bring what has the greatest meaning in our life, the Person of Christ.

May we be cross bearers for the kingdom and His harvest.


