REFLECTION

THE PRIESTLY PRAYER OF CHRIST

As children growing up, my mother encouraged us to pray the Rosary in the evening. She was met with mixed enthusiasm: Do I have to? I've something else to do...and so on. Even when we had finished the Rosary, my mother would remain on her knees praying, and I couldn't help but overhear her prayer. She was remembering those who were sick, or members of the family away from home. Today we eavesdrop, if you will, on the prayer of Jesus on the night before he died.



He prays that his Father may be glorified by his death and resurrection. He prays for his disciples. He sees them as a gift from the Father, and commends them for their faith in keeping God's Word. He prays that we will build a strong relationship with him and one another.

During the Last Supper, Jesus knew how weak and frail his apostles were. Yet he made a daring act of faith in their ability to proclaim the gospel. In the same way, Jesus knows how weak we are. Yet he makes a bold act of faith for us, if I may read into his prayer. "I know they can do it, Father," he prays. "Do not take them away from their responsibilities at home or from their opportunities at work. Instead, send them into the world to face today's issues with confidence and courage."

What a magnificent task this is – to be sent into the world to change it! Not to run away from its problems of poverty or oppression, but to plunge into them and improve the lot of God's people. Not to turn away from the world's injustice and violence, but to turn toward them and resolve them. Yes, we are sent into the world to confront it, to influence it, and to change it for the better.

As we await the great feast of Pentecost, we unite ourselves with the apostles and Mary to pray for the transforming power of the Spirit to come into our lives. The Holy Spirit will help us to recognize the love that Christ has for each of us, and give us the strength we need to go forth to witness to him, to reflect his love, compassion and mercy to a needy world.

LITURGY SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23

Gospel: Mark 16:15-20
