REFLECTION

THE SIGN OF THE CROSS IN SLOW MOTION

I remember years ago in Grammar School memorizing what the Trinity meant. "In God there are three divine Persons; really distinct and equal in all things: the Father, Son and Holy Ghost." It was drummed into us that the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God, and yet there is only one God.

While we will never be able to understand this great mystery of the Trinity, we still can appreciate its importance in our lives. That is why it is good, every now and then, to make the sign of the cross in slow motion so that we can better understand its meaning.

When we touch our forehead and say: "In the name of the Father", we think of how God revealed himself to Moses on Mount Sinai, as a God who is kind and merciful and slow to anger. What a lovely description of God our Father, who is creator of all that is.

After touching our foreheads, we touch our chest while saying the words: "And of the Son". We touch our chest because that is where the heart is. In so doing we think of Jesus. For God so loved the world that he gave us his only Son so that we might have eternal life. When we think of Jesus, we think of someone who became one of us. We think of the love he shared with us, how he made room at his table for outcasts and sinners; how he encouraged us to forgive, how he showed the depth of his love by dying on the cross.

Finally, we move to the shoulders, and as we do so, we think of the Holy Spirit who plays such an important role in our lives. The Holy Spirit is the great source for good, one to turn to when decisions have to be made, and one who consoles us when we fail. The Holy Spirit inspires us to follow Jesus more closely.

And so we come to the end of the blessing by joining our hands and saying "Amen", which means: I believe. When we bless ourselves we are praying to the Father who is gracious and merciful, to the Son who died and rose that we might have life, and to the Holy Spirit who leads us into all truth.


Corpus Christi Food Drive


First Sundays of the month will begin again in September when Confirmation resumes. The calendar for the upcoming Confirmation session is forthcoming.


