REFLECTION

THE GREAT GIFT OF THE EUCHARIST

You may ask: why do we set aside a special day to honor the Body and Blood of Christ? Don't we do this at every Mass? Yes we do, but we're human and we forget, and we take things for granted – even important things.

We need to be reminded that every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we experience the presence of the Lord among us under the form of bread and wine. It is Jesus' way of giving himself to us, of sharing his life with us.


When the celebrant takes the host into his hands at Mass he says: "This is my Body which will be given up for you", the bread is changed into the Body of Christ. When he takes the chalice and says: "This is the cup of my Blood", the wine is changed into the Blood of Christ. Christ is now present in a special way among us. This is what Jesus did at the Last Supper. We do it in memory of him.

There is much to be said about the Eucharist under the headings of meal, memorial and sacrifice. But today, on this feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we emphasize his presence under the appearance of bread and wine. As Catholics we believe the presence of the Lord in the Eucharist is not a symbol, but rather the actual Body and Blood of Christ – the same Christ who was born in Bethlehem, the same Christ who died on the Cross, the same Christ who rose on Easter Sunday.

As we come forward to receive the Lord in communion, let us be mindful of who it is that we are receiving. It is none other than the Lord Jesus who nourishes us with his very life.

LITURGY

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8

Moses explained to the people the commandments he had received from God. Upon hearing them, the entire community immediately agreed they would do as God had told them. Moses then sacrificed young bulls and sprinkled the people with their blood, calling it the blood of the covenant they had made.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-15

Jesus did not offer God the blood of sacrifices, but instead he offered up his own blood to cleanse all people of the transgressions they had committed under the first covenant with God. Christ instead brought a new covenant, which, if kept, would lead to eternal life.

Gospel: Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

Jesus sent two of his disciples to prepare the Passover supper. During the meal he blessed bread and offered it to them saying, "This is my body." He then offered them wine and called it his blood, "the blood of the covenant, to be poured out on behalf of many."



Vocal- Instrumental Group - contact our Music Director, Krzysztof Kowalewski at the parish office.


