REFLECTION

LOOKING INTO OUR OWN HEARTS

In his teaching Jesus highlights a problem, if you like, with the practice of faith. Those who are diligent, externally faithful, dutiful and adhere to the rules can appear as holy and righteous. In truth, many are, because how else do we witness to faith than by practicing it? But what if this practice of faith – these acts of piety, intended to express both our love of God and our neighbor – masks the true condition of our hearts, as we know was the case with many of the Pharisees in Jesus' day?

The Pharisees had strict rules on ritual cleanliness, which they adhered to scrupulously. Jesus' disciples, it appears, were more laid back in this department, earning them the rebuke of the Pharisees. Jesus, however, as he so often does, strikes at the heart of the matter. We are not made clean or righteous or acceptable to God by some kind of external cleansing process because such things do not change our hearts.

Let us look into our own heart. Do we recognize any of the following in our own heart: evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, lewdness, envy, slander, arrogance and folly? If the answer is yes, what do we conclude? That we are righteous? No, of course not. We recognize that we are sinners in need of salvation, and we cry out, as Paul cried out, "Who will deliver me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!"

We need to resist the spirit of the Pharisee, which lurks in us all. The spirit of the Pharisee is alive and kicking when we think things such as: don't say anything that could offend anyone; focus on what is right with the 'church' and its 'leadership' don't be critical; promote the status quo; don't make 'waves'; don't call anyone 'out'; respect 'authority'; cover up those who 'spiritually abuse' others – keep it 'secret' within our family; don't ask any hard questions. The refuge of the Pharisee in us is hypocrisy – in the name of Jesus, resist it, cast it out and strive to live truthful, honest and authentic Christian Lives.

First Reading: Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel and told them if it did not please them to serve God, then they must decide who they would serve. The people claimed that God had brought them out of slavery and protected them on their journey. Therefore, they would serve, the Lord their God, and no one else.

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:21-32 or 5:2a, 25-32 Husbands and wives should love one another as Christ loved the Church. They should nourish and care for each other as Christ cared for the church. Through the union between the two, they become one.

Gospel: John 6:60-69

Many of Jesus' followers were still disturbed by his teaching of the living bread, which they could not yet fully understand. Jesus explained that the Spirit gives life, and flesh is unimportant. Some of the disciples decided to leave. Jesus asked if the Twelve also wanted to leave. Although they do not completely understand yet, they have enough faith in Jesus to stay because they believe he is God's holy one.
