## REFLECTION

### **WASHED CLEAN IN BAPTISM**

I have fond memories of our parish trip to the Holy Land, and visiting the River Jordan. I remember it was a very hot day and it was refreshing to step into the cool waters of the river, and be taken aback at the thought that it was in this river that Jesus was baptized. I blessed my fellow parishioners with holy water and we renewed our baptismal promises.

I thought of the crowds coming to John for a baptism of repentance, to ready themselves to meet Jesus, the Messiah. How surprised he must have been when Jesus came to him and humbly submitted to be baptized. By allowing himself to be baptized, Jesus was immersing himself into our lives. He was one of us. Jesus, Emmanuel, came to us, lived with us, prayed with us and even allowed himself to be tempted like us. It was only natural that Jesus should extend his identity with us to being baptized like us.

Which brings us to our own baptism. Some early Christians compared baptism to *grafting*. They saw farmers graft a twig from one tree to another, allowing it to draw new life from the new tree. In a similar way, by baptism we have been grafted into Christ's body, the Church, and are now sharing the very life of Christ. In other words, we grow and become one with Christ by imitating him.

We treat others with respect because that is how Christ treats them. We forgive others from the heart because that is how Christ forgives them. Because of our union with him through baptism, he depends on us to teach and preach and heal after his example. Once someone asked God: "What are you doing for the poor and the needy of the world?" And God answered: "I created you."

Today, as we leave Church, we bless ourselves with holy water as a reminder of our baptism, when we were set free from sin and washed clean in its waters. Let us leave today with the final words of the Mass ringing in our ears: Go forth in peace to love and to serve the Lord.

## First Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7

Isaiah tells of the Lord's Servant, who will be inconspicuous, but will not rest until justice is established. The Lord then tells his servant that he was formed to be "a light for the nations."
