SCRIPTURES:

June 24, 2018- Nativity of John the Baptist

First Reading: ISAIAH TELLS HOW THE LORD CALLED TO HIM FROM BIRTH AND GAVE HIM HIS NAME. HE EXPLAINS THAT ALTHOUGH HE THOUGHT HE TOILED IN VAIN, HIS STRENGTH IS IN THE LORD IN WHOSE SIGHT HE HAS BEEN MADE GLORIOUS. GOD MADE HIM A LIGHT TO THE NATIONS SO THAT SALVATION MAY REACH TO THE ENDS OF THE EARTH. (ISAIAH 49: 1-6)

SECOND READING: JOHN HERALDS THE COMING OF JESUS BY PROCLAIMING A BAPTISM OF REPENTANCE. HE SAYS, "BEHOLD, ONE IS COMING AFTER ME; I AM NOT WORTHY TO UNFASTEN THE SANDALS ON HIS FEET." THE CHILDREN OF THE FAMILY OF ABRAHAM AND THOSE WHO ARE GOD-FEARING HAVE RECEIVED THE WORD OF SALVATION. (ACTS 13: 22-26)

GOSPEL: ELIZABETH GAVE BIRTH TO A SON WHOM SHE NAMED JOHN. ON THE EIGHTH DAY, WHEN HER NEIGHBORS AND RELATIVES CAME TO CIRCUMCISE THE CHILD, THEY WANTED TO CALL HIM ZECHARIAH, AFTER HER FATHER, BUT ELIZABETH'S HUSBAND WROTE ON A TABLET, "HIS NAME IS JOHN." IMMEDIATELY HE SPOKE BLESSING GOD, AND THE PEOPLE BECAME AFRAID. ALL WHO HEARD OF THE INCIDENT KNEW THAT THE HAND OF THE LORD WAS WITH JOHN. (LUKE 1: 57-66, 80)

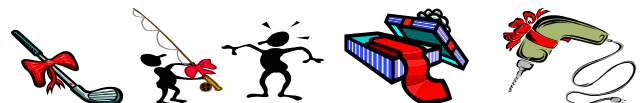

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY

The idea of a special day to honor Fathers goes back to 1908. In that year two different celebrations were held, one in June in Washington State and one in July in Fairmont, West Virginia. In Fairmont it was celebrated as a Church Service at Williams Memorial Methodist Church. The idea of the service was suggested by Grace Golden Clayton to the pastor to honor the men who died in the deadly mine explosion at Monongah some six months earlier. In all, 361 men died and many of them were fathers; this was before the days of Social Security, so providing for the families of these men was a difficult task. Another possible inspiration for the service was Mother's Day which had been celebrated some two months earlier in Grafton, West Virginia, a town about 15 miles away. The celebration soon became fixed for the third Sunday of June.

Unofficial support began to come from figures such as William Jennings Bryan and President Woodrow Wilson. President Calvin Coolidge recommended it as a national holiday in 1924. However, it was not until 1966, that President Lyndon Johnson made Father's Day a holiday to be celebrated on the third Sunday of June. In 1972, Richard Nixon made it official.

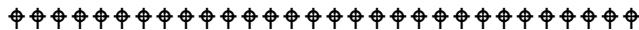
The role of Father is a complex one. He must inspire his children, be loving, impose discipline, set high standards for them, lead by example and encourage his children to achieve as much as possible in life. He must not demand too much, yet he should not condone indifference in his child either.

We are very familiar with the Lord's Prayer, the Our Father. It is the most wonderful prayer that we have. Sometimes I am reluctant to use the figure of God as Father with children, realizing that the Father figure may not be a positive one for all. Some fathers do not fulfill their responsibilities well; they are not present in the important moments of their children's lives. Many do an outstanding job of fatherhood. We know that God as Father is a wonderful presence in our lives. He is the one who sustains and protects us, who guides and encourages us, who forgives us & consoles us in time of trouble. God is gentleness and strength, patience and justice; He is a welcoming and a healing presence. God is Creator and Redeemer, to be theological. Yet the best word is the word that Jesus used: ABBA, which is an easy word for children to say.

There are many verses in the Bible which are memorable, but perhaps the one that we might remember this day and this week is this: "God Is Love, And Whoever Remains In Love Remains In God and God in him." (1 John 4:16B) Yes God is Love and because He is Love we can have confidence that He will lead us home to eternal happiness.
