### 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time July 8, 2018

**First Reading:** Ezekiel is moved to respond to the call of God and to accentuate his teaching with a direct reference to the Word of God. **(Ezekiel 2:2-5)**

**Second Reading:** Paul had questioned the value of his suffering, and God replied, "My grace is enough for you, for strength is made perfect in weakness." Paul then realized that although he was weak against persecution, he was strong in faith. **(II Corinthians 12: 7-10)**

# STORIES IN GLASS

The buildings that we use, in which we pray and celebrate Eucharist and the other sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Marriage and Reconciliation, can only come alive when we enter there and share what is already a living, dynamic faith. This means we must practice our faith from Monday through Saturday.

Now that summer is here and school is out we are entitled to relax a bit on the weekends. However, that does not mean that we can make the weekend Mass an optional event. The call to be faithful to Jesus is a call that we must respond to each day and certainly that includes Mass on weekends, summer included. "Remember to keep holy the Sabbath Day," is the third commandment which goes back to Moses and is recorded in the Book of Exodus. To keep "holy the Sabbath Day" is not an option for us. The summer months and our warm weather invite us to relax at the shore, here by the lake, or to visit our local and national parks. The beauty of our land, its majestic mountains, its crystal clear rivers and streams, our lakes and valleys can all reveal to us the beauty and majesty of God.

The beauty of God in creation is one way to experience God in our World. Our churches help us to experience God in a different way. The obvious way is the celebration of the Eucharist and of the sacraments. However, churches are also designed to help us pray. In our church the stained glass windows are also designed to introduce us to certain saints or incidents in the life of Mary, the Mother of God. The windows were designed by Simon Berasaluce, 1914-1993, who lived in San Sebastian in the Basque region of Spain. He was trained in Madrid and Barcelona, but it was in Paris that he found his place in the art of stained glass. He received many awards for his work. He came to the United States in 1951 and worked at Hiemer and Company in Clifton, New Jersey.

He brought with him the knowledge of the emerging medium of faceted glass and the innovation that was then part of the European liturgical decorative arts. His expertise ranged from Romanesque to modern experimental and he was a master of portraits.

All the center panels of each window have an apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary arranged chronologically counter-clockwise, beginning on the parking lot side with the window nearest the pulpit. This has three parts, St. Anne Teaching the Blessed Virgin Mary (panel nearest pulpit), St. Dominic Receiving the Rosary, and in the third panel, The Annunciation to Mary.

In the second window we find: 1) The Birth of Jesus, 2) Our Lady of Guadalupe, and 3) The Holy Family. The figure subjects on each side of the center panel are part of scenes from the life of Jesus with emphasis on the Blessed Mother. In the third window on the parking lot side we have Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal in the center and the Apparition of the Christ Child to St. Anthony (on the altar side) and Our Lady of Lourdes on the opposite side.

When the medieval cathedrals such as Milan, Cologne, Chartres and Notre Dame were built, the spiritual glass windows told Biblical stories that helped an illiterate people to know parts of the Bible. This was before the printing press was invented and books were copied by hand which were very rare and very expensive.

Today the need is not the same but the stained glass windows still speak to us of our wonderful biblical stories. Take the time to look closely at our windows. They speak to us of faith.
