SCRIPTURES:

August 19th–Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: A RICH WOMAN INVITES MANY GUESTS TO HER HOME TO EAT AND DRINK. SHE APPEALS TO THOSE WHO LACK UNDERSTANDING TO FORSAKE FOOLISHNESS AND “ADVANCE IN THE WAY OF UNDERSTANDING.” (PROVERBS 9:1-6)

SECOND READING: PAUL ADVISES THE EPHESIANS TO ABANDON FOOLISH WAYS AND EVIL DEEDS. ALL CHRISTIANS SHOULD CONCENTRATE ON DOING GOD’S WILL BEFORE ALL OTHER THINGS. HE REMINDS THEM TO ALWAYS GIVE THANKS TO GOD IN THE NAME OF JESUS CHRIST. (EPHESIANS 5:15-20)

GOSPEL: JESUS HAD JUST TOLD THE CROWD THAT ANYONE WHO ATE OF THE BREAD HE PLANNED TO GIVE WOULD LIVE FOREVER, AND THAT THIS BREAD WAS HIS FLESH, WHICH HE WOULD GIVE UP FOR THE SAKE OF THE WORLD. THE PEOPLE DO NOT UNDERSTAND, BUT JESUS REASSURES THEM THAT HIS FLESH IS REAL FOOD AND THAT “THOSE WHO FEED ON THIS BREAD SHALL LIVE FOREVER.” (John 6: 51-58)

LIVE LIFE MORE FULLY

Each month as an inspiration for my monthly reflection day, I usually turn to the writings of Joyce Rupp. This past week one of her books seemed to really speak to me about what God calls us to during these summer months. She reminded me that the child of our very young days took great delight in life, discovering everything for the first time and being full of awe at the most ordinary things of life. As we grew older this part of ourselves sometimes got lost. We began to lose a beautiful and essential part of ourselves. We became serious and competitive. We learned to worry about what others think of us, to fear the consequences of not doing the accepted thing, and to be fearful of failure. We get our applause by working hard and living up to others' expectations. Our culture seems to be saying: "The busier you are, the more important you are. Work gives your life meaning and value. Doing is more important than being." We are praised for how hard we work, how much money we make, and how much we produce. Success and accomplishments are good, but we cannot base our life or our entire identity on these things.

Our attitude toward life has a great impact on our spiritual life as well. Re-discovering our ability to wonder and be in awe at the wonders of God's creation can help us to become contemplative. (Contemplation is that prayer of quiet in which we are at home with God.) In contemplation we do not worry about the success of our prayer, or if God is going to answer our prayer, or if we are praying the right way. We are called to simply be with God and enjoy His love and presence.

Let us then during these remaining summer weeks -when we experience more time for leisure - take the time to learn to be more receptive, more peaceful, and more ready to recognize the many gifts God has given us. Life is meant to be celebrated, enjoyed, delighted in, and embraced in all its mystery. May our spiritual life be strengthened and our awareness of God's presence become more alive in us as we strive to live life more fully.

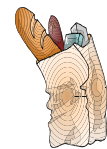
