SCRIPTURES:

November 11th Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: ELIJAH ASKED A WIDOW FOR A CUP OF WATER AND A PIECE OF BREAD. SHE TOLD HIM SHE WAS ALMOST OUT OF FLOUR, AND THAT SHE AND HER SON WOULD SOON STARVE. ELIJAH TOLD HER NOT TO BE AFRAID, AS GOD HAD TOLD HIM THE JAR OF FLOUR WOULD NOT GO EMPTY, AND SHE AND HER SON HAD PLENTY TO EAT.

(1 KINGS 17: 10-16)

SECOND READING: THE HIGH PRIESTS ENTERED THE SANCTUARY EACH YEAR AND OFFERED SACRIFICE, BUT NOT A SACRIFICE OF THEIR OWN BLOOD. JUST AS PEOPLE DIE ONCE AND ARE JUDGED, CHRIST WAS OFFERED UP ONCE FOR THE SINS OF MANY. (HEBREWS 9: 24- 28)

GOSPEL: JESUS EXPRESSED DISGUST OVER THE HYPOCRISY OF SOME OF THE SCRIBES FOR WANTING SPECIAL TREATMENT FROM THE PEOPLE. HE WATCHED THE WEALTHY PUT LARGE CONTRIBUTIONS INTO THE COLLECTION BOX, BUT EXPLAINED THAT WHAT THEY GAVE WAS SURPLUS WEALTH, AND NOT A REAL SACRIFICE. HE TOLD THEM THE BIGGEST DONATION WAS A SMALL AMOUNT FROM A WIDOW, BECAUSE SHE HAD GIVEN UP THE ONLY MONEY THAT SHE HAD TO LIVE ON.

Missionary Initiative

One of the tasks of Catechesis is to promote a missionary spirit that prepares Christians to witness to Christ in society.

The catechists of elementary, middle and high school students prepare our youngsters to accept and live out this task in their adult years. One of the most effective ways of doing this is to provide our students with a variety of supervised service opportunities.

Our students here at Our Lady Star of the Sea are involved in such missionary activity. All of the students will be bringing food items to class over the next few weeks for the Thanksgiving food baskets that will be distributed on November 20th. Our 8th graders will help assemble the food baskets for many in our area who would otherwise have very little on Thanksgiving Day.

Opportunities such as this build awareness of people's everyday needs and help students recognize that they have a responsibility to reach out to others. We try to help them make the connection between their actions and Jesus' call to care for others and the Church's commitment to social justice.


Through our initiation into the Christian community, each of us is given the vocation to "put on Christ," share the Good News, and to carry on the work of the Lord.

At the end of every Liturgy we hear, "Go, the Mass is ended." Some of us may recall the Latin, "Ite, missa est," which translates, "Go, He is sent." The Mass never really ends because just as the Father sent His Son, Jesus, so we are sent to continue the mission of Jesus here and now in Lake Hopatcong, and the surrounding vicinity.
