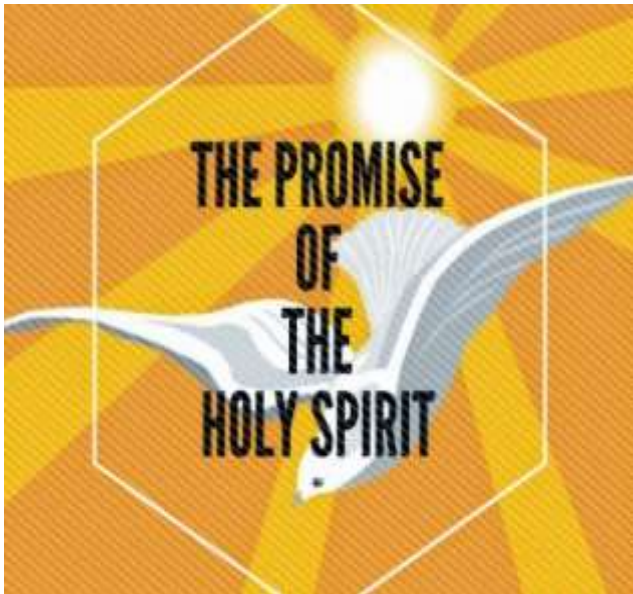
**Introduction to the Liturgy**
