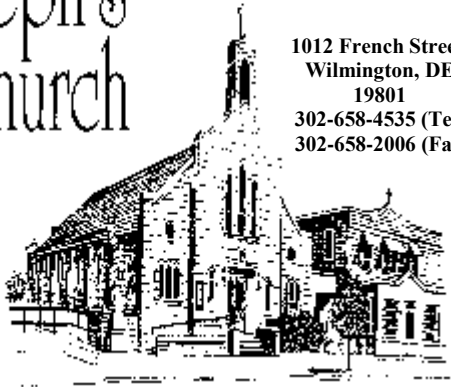

**End of Year Giving**  
 Parish Goal — \$10,000

This is the final report for our 2018 End-of-Year Parish Gift campaign. Whether you contributed \$1 or \$2,000, your support is profoundly appreciated. My ask was that each able adult prayerfully contribute \$100 to help with the end-of-year expenses of the parish. Eighty households and two church organizations participated. Some donated more than the \$100 and others shared what they could. Because of the great support, we have far exceeded our goal.

As we rise into 2019, please be mindful that the parish struggles, each month, to bring in the required amount to meet the basic needs of the parish. On a weekly basis, we need envelope contributions totaling \$4,901. Most weeks we fall short of this amount.

I ask that you remain prayerful about your 2019 weekly or monthly contributions. I earnestly pray that the Lord continues to bless your household. I pray that each family can consistently contribute more per week **than last year. Whether it's 10%, 15% or some other increased amount, it will help the parish to pay our bills throughout the year.**

**I recognize that some can not and I obviously don't want any hardships for any one.** But for those who can, I pray that you will express your blessings to the parish by increasing your 2019 weekly giving.

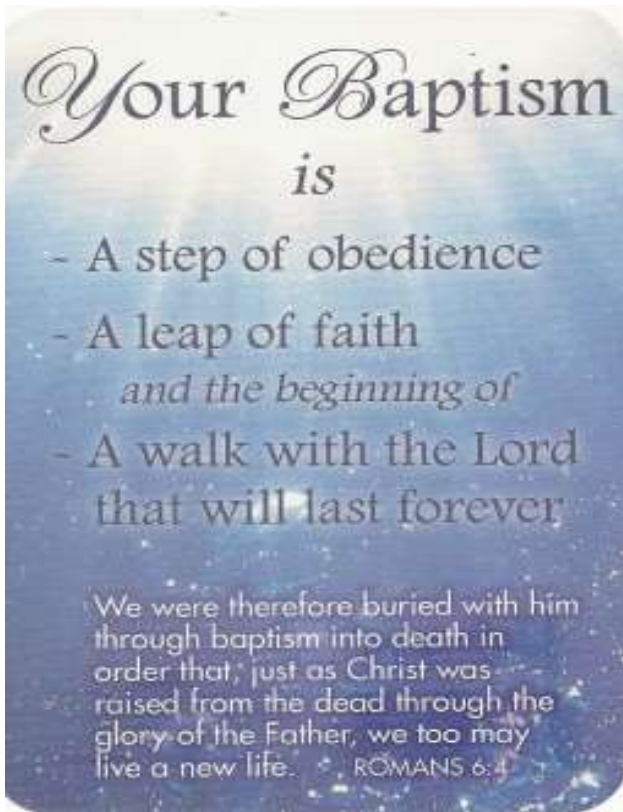
