MUSINGS OF FATHER JIM: Dear Catholic Community of Meade County,

I hardly got to know you. Thank you for your welcome and your hopeful faith in the future. I have been through my first security check. I was patted down, because I had forgotten my rosary in my left pocket. I suppose that is a good omen.

It is a bit surreal for me to have the great opportunity to have a sabbatical, not only a sabbatical, but a sabbatical in the Holy Land. It is hard for me to give up that it will be a working sabbatical. Sabbatical, of course, comes from the notion of the Sabbath, the Seventh day rest that is needed in our human lives of faithful service to the Lord. I again, am grateful to Bishop John, to Fr. Ted, and all of you who are giving the time and resources to make it possible for me to unite more closely with the Lord through this time of pilgrimage and study.

It feels much like when I left 31 years ago to the seminary, sight unseen of the seminary, making the 15 hour drive to Columbus Ohio to the Pontifical College Josephinum. It was this same time of year, a time of looking forward to the harvest, and preparing to sow the seeds of the winter wheat, a time of fall, but Indian Summer, too. It is 15 ½ hours in the air for me this time to an unknown place for a mostly unknown destiny and unknown companions.

The security checks only seem to highlight the giving up of security and the trust in God that is essential to our lives of faith, whether that be in marriage, a single life, or a celibate religious life. Thanks to those who cooperated with the Protecting God's Children program and all the efforts of the Church to provide a secure place to nourish and grow our faiths together.

I hope to offer the Eucharist daily remembering you each day in the sacrifice. I have always cherished the phrase in the ordination ceremony, "May God bring to completion the good work he has begun in you!" It is a wonderful prayer.

RACISM & LIFE ISSUES: In their November 2018 Pastoral Letter Against Racism, Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love, the U.S. Catholic bishops wrote, "racism occurs because a person ignores the fundamental truth that...all [humans are] equally made in the image of God." Racism fails to acknowledge the dignity with which God creates each person, and it contributes to a culture of death. The Church in the United States has spoken out consistently against abortion, assisted suicide, euthanasia, the death penalty, and other threats to human life; it is not a secret that these attacks have severely affected people of color. These brothers and sisters are targeted for abortion, disproportionally affected by poverty, have the greatest numbers on death row, and are most likely to feel pressure to end their lives through assisted suicide when facing serious illness. The feast of St. Peter Claver is an opportunity to highlight the connection between racism and various attacks against human life.
