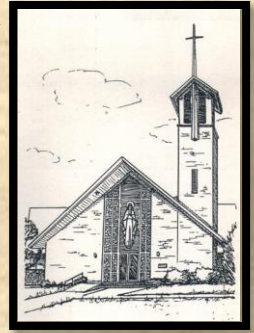

5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER ----- SHOW ME THE FRUIT

"They even refused to believe that he was a disciple." —Acts 9:26

Paul had been a notable sinner. By the grace of God, Paul became a new convert to Christianity. Many in the Jerusalem community couldn't believe Paul's conversion was sincere. "They even refused to believe that he was a disciple" (Acts 9:26). Paul was notorious for persecuting the Church. Understandably, the Christians didn't trust Paul. They may have thought he was pretending to be a Christian so he could later arrest them (see Acts 26:10).

Scripture cautions against too readily taking new believers at their word. When the new generation of Israelites promised to serve the Lord, Joshua wanted extra assurance of their willingness to commit themselves to the Lord (Jos 24:19ff). John the Baptizer didn't believe the Sadducees and Pharisees as they came forward to be baptized. He challenged them to "give some evidence that" they meant to reform (Mt 3:8). Similarly, Paul advises the Church not to promote a new convert too quickly, "lest he become conceited" (1 Tm 3:6).

Are you a new disciple of Jesus? If you face this situation of not being readily accepted by the community, take Jesus' advice. Humble yourself before God and concentrate on bearing fruit (Jn 15:16). Accept your cross as a pruning from the Father, your loving Vinegrower, Who always does what is best for you (Jn 15:1-2). Bear the fruit of "patient endurance, kindness, generosity, faith, mildness, and chastity" (Gal 5:22-23) and "good deeds" (Eph 2:10). "Give...evidence" of your belief in Jesus (Mt 3:8). Glorify God by bearing much fruit and being His faithful disciple (Jn 15:8). "That should be the proof they need" (Mt 8:4).

Prayer: Father, prune me any way You choose. I am all Yours.

***Weird Things Catholics Believe :MARY**

The devotion that Catholics show to Mary is so foreign to much of the Protestant world that it doesn't even look Christian to them — it looks like idolatry, like a reversion to a kind of polytheism. As such it seems not only wrong but deeply sinful because it seems to divert worship from the only One who should truly receive it, in other words, from God himself. A large part of the problem that Protestants have in understanding Mary can, I think, be traced to a rather unlikely source: the fact that the Protestant and Catholic ideas of prayer are actually somewhat different. Catholicism contains the entire understanding of prayer that exists in the Protestant world, but it goes further, meaning that the Catholic idea is more expansive and inclusive. For most Protestants, prayer exists simply between a human soul and God. It is a two-way street: You pray to God and God responds as God wills.

For a Catholic there is much more to prayer than that. Our participation in the Mystical Body of Christ makes possible an intimate connection with the saints in heaven, and through this connection God permits us to be in prayerful relationship with those saints. This is especially true in the case of Mary, the Mother of God. Thus, for a Catholic, prayer is not a two-way street but rather countless streets and avenues that we can venture down. We don't need a map because we have friends on all these streets and each one of those friends will point us toward our ultimate destination — God. We can and do pray to saints, and especially to the Mother of God. Yet no Catholic sees that prayer as the same as one he would make to God. It is not completely unrelated, yet it is radically different. In Catholic understanding, Mary is like a pane of perfectly clear glass. As light reaches the glass and flows through it, so our prayers reach the Mother of God and flow through her to her Son. Thus, for a Catholic, prayer to Mary never stops with her. Prayer to Mary is ultimately prayer to prayer to Christ. And in a very real sense, she perfects these prayers.

Month of May is the Month of Mary: In this month, learn more about Marian devotion. Our Lady is the Mother of the Universal Church. There are many ways she has affected Christians in various times and places during these nearly 2,000 years since she walked the earth. It is fascinating to read the stories behind each one, and many are associated with miracles, apparitions, saints, and holy images. Will one of them touch you in a special way? This month (May) consider researching and adopting a special devotion to Mary under one of her many titles (find a short list here). For example, Our Lady of Fatima (whose feast is May 13th), Our Lady of Sorrows, Our Lady Undoer of Knots, Our Lady of Guadalupe, or Our Lady of Perpetual Help. This could become an annual tradition for you and your family to learn about a new Marian devotion each May.
