Pastor's Page

Happy Father's Day to all fathers. Like with motherhood, fatherhood is a great gift which has a great importance in in society and most importantly in the lives of their children and their wife. But, in our western culture fatherhood has been lost among so many (and many almost feel like they are supposed to apologize for holding to fatherhood as being important).

Often in entertainment fatherhood is mocked or seen as unimportant. In movies, the dads are usually bumbling idiots who have no idea about responsibilities and that their main role is to teach their children how to throw a ball. But fatherhood is absolutely crucial. The father, when he shows strength of character and responsibility and sacrificing for others (especially for his wife), the children learn how to be responsible and give of themselves for others. Often, a loving father (even if he is not very affectionate physically) who cares about his children and gives them the attention of one on one when he can, when he talks about important things in life those things often become more important to them (more than sports). When a father looks on his children with love and admiration, they have much greater self-esteem whereas when fathers look on their children with annoyance, the children often how a low self-esteem. When the children know dad is there for them, they feel safe and protected, and by it are able to challenge themselves when they face obstacles in life. Often, a father who is strong in virtue (even if he is not physically strong), naturally draws out of his son healthier masculinity (not machismo and sexism) and draws out of his daughter her being able to be truly feminine.

Do we recognize that so many problems today of women being treated as sexual objects stems back to men not having fathers showing them how to truly reverence woman as daughters of God, but simply are told by men (sometimes their own dads) that women are there simply to be used for their own selfish desires? Even when we look at priests who are called to be spiritual fathers, many who do not know what it means to have a father's heart tend to focus on themselves first and by it do not model for others God the Father. When a father truly has a love and reverence for his wife, the children often show greater appreciation and reverence for their mother. When he fosters chastity, the children tend to have a greater awareness of how chaste love is lived and less drawn to treating the opposite sex as an object of their own selfish pleasures. The time when children begin to push certain limits in the home and especially against their mother, a loving father is able to firmly, humbly, and lovingly correct them and by it teaches them their world is not about living for themselves, but how to be mindful of others (especially their own family members). When a father protects his home from sin (so is mindful of what his children watch and listen to), there is often more freedom, joy, and trust.

The model for fatherhood is God the Father and He defines what a father truly is. Yet, often those who have issues with their fathers tend to struggle with how to relate to God the Father (because they start with their experiences of their imperfect father and project it on God, rather than seeking to understand God the Father and then seeing their fathers in the light of the perfect Father). And for us to grow in the awareness of God the Father and how to relate to Him as children of God, we must look constantly to Jesus (the Beloved Son... and remember he who sees Jesus sees the Father). So all fathers, you are crucial in the lives of your children. Keep striving to grow in your relationship with the Lord so he may keep showing you the life and love you are called to.

Great Marriage Videos — As a parish we subscribe to Formed.org which has many great videos, talks, and catechesis on different aspects of the faith. Formed is connected with the Augustine Institute which produces some of the newest high-quality videos on the faith. They created some great videos on marriage to help couples preparing for marriage, but it can be a great experience for those of you who are married to be renewed or receive little insights on the beautiful vocation and ways to live it more fully as God calls you to. There are eight marriage videos: one video is 48 minutes long, three averaging 35 minutes each, and the other four averaging only 18 minutes long each. Fr. Kevin highly recommends everyone to take time to watch them so as to grow in your understanding of the purpose of the sacrament of marriage, and for those who are married to discuss some of their points with your spouse (things you love about marriage, ways you want to live it better, things you learned that you were not aware of). Marriage is an extraordinary gift from God but because of the challenges that come with it one can lose sight of some of the beauty of it (or in the midst of painful experiences, one can become very negative or cynical about married life).

To watch, go to formed.org and click on "Enter Code". Then enter the parish access code GDC829. You will need to register under Holy Family. Once in, click on "Study", then click on "Sacramental Preparation" and then click on "Beloved". Watch the four videos on part one "Mystery and Meaning of Marriage" (these are the longer ones but they reflect on the deeper meaning of the sacrament). The other four videos (those that are about 18 each) and one can watch them by going to part 2: "Living Marriage".

Work in the Church — Next weekend will be our last weekend in the church before we start renovations in the church beginning on Monday, June 25th (so after the 10:30am on Sunday, June 24th the church will be locked and we will begin the removal of everything in the sanctuary). The work includes the interior of the church being painted, the pews re-upholstered, the carpet in the sanctuary removed and hardwood floor installed, the wall behind the altar reconfigured and painted, new cloths on the kneelers, and new carpeting in the aisles. Most of the work is being contracted, but we are looking for help with people being part of a team that will remove the kneelers and take off the old cloth and put on the new fabric. Beginning on Monday, June 18th the painters are planning on beginning the cleaning and repairing of the walls, and a team will be removing the upholstery from the pews as well to help expedite the renovations (so when you come to Mass on June 23rd and 24th there will be no upholstery on the pews. All Masses from June 25th – the morning Mass on July 28th will be in the Parish Center. Any funerals of our parishioners at that time will be celebrated by Fr. Kevin in another local parish.

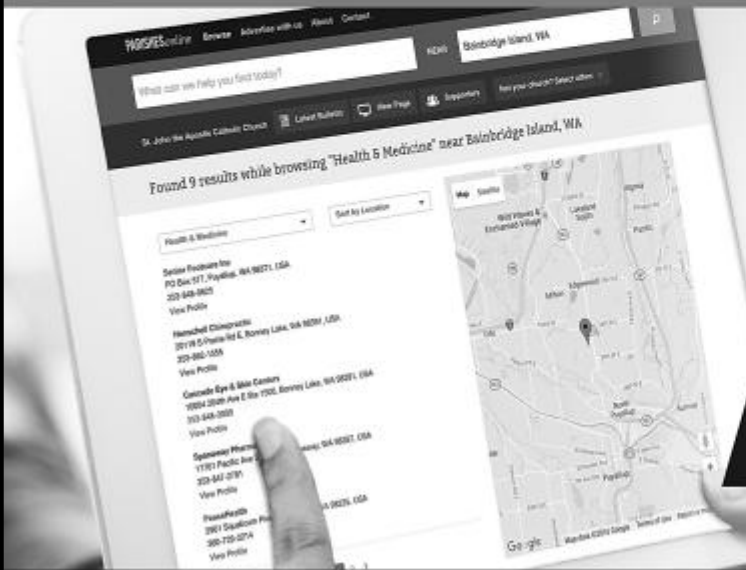

This is the final step before receiving the Sacrament of Holy Orders as a deacon next year. An acolyte can purify the vessels at Mass if a Deacon is not present, and he also can expose and repose the Blessed Sacrament for adoration (he cannot give Benediction though). All are welcome to attend this Mass.
