## Pastor's Page — Rev. Kevin Cook



I just want to thank so many people who over these years showed great examples of faith to me and so many others. It is easy to underestimate the impact one person's or a parish community's example can have on others when they are trying to grow in being more Christ-like. It is easy to get discouraged in this day and age when we see the direction society is going in morally and relationally, and because of it we can easily lose sight that there are wonderful things happening.

When I think about Holy Family, there were times I would get discouraged with seeing less people at Mass, or less baptisms and weddings, or the number of children in Faith Formation being less than when I can eight years ago. Many times I would wonder if my failings were the primary reason why this was happening. I am certain my defects, deficiencies, and sins had impact on some in a negative way, but at the same time I trust that the graces that the Lord offered through the sacraments, or the guidance I tried to offer, as faithfully and frequently as best I could, had an even greater impact upon those who were open in their hearts to the guidance from the Lord. In the last twenty years it seems like our society has thrown new challenges our way almost every day, and we can easily get overwhelmed by even just one of these challenges, but each one of us has to constantly learn how to root whatever the new challenge is in Christ. We face challenges in society as a whole, but also in our workplace, in our neighborhood, in our relationships, in our parish, in our family, in our health, or just our own internal struggles. We have to keep recognizing we are facing some challenge and bring it before the Lord. I think I can say that over these years at Holy Family I have seen so many people not only persevere but also grow in this path with Christ.

I look at the work of different groups in the parish, such as the St. Vincent DePaul Society and the works of the Knights of Columbus and seeing how many thousands of people they helped. Think about how every week parishioners were responding to people in need and not drawing any attention to themselves. Also, I think about how every week we have parishioners bringing communion to the homebound and helping them in different ways in their lives. There are the ladies in the parish who have made many blankets for the sick or for babies over these years. Other parishioners have been involved with suicide prevention.

Over these years we have faced tremendous tragedies of deaths of our loved ones and in such a moving way to see how parishioners came together to help out in whatever ways they could. One particular memory was the tragic death of Pat Slavin in the attacks at her home and and the Galleria Mall. I remember how the media was struck that we would pray for all those involved, including for DJ Young who took lives, but especially how they were struck when one of our parishioners came out of the church to say she knows Pat would have forgiven him.

I think about Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament here. We started adoration Monday – Friday approximately six and a half years ago. Every week we offered 55 hours of time in the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. So that would be approximately 18,600 hours of adoration in which parishioners spent time before Our Lord opening their hearts to him in silence and only God knows how so many ways He moved our hearts. In the church, a simple thing such as moving the tabernacle to the center of the church impacted many people to become more aware of Christ's presence. On an experiential level, I know as a priest (and visiting priests have mentioned it to me), how so many parishioners here receive Jesus in Mass with great attentiveness and show the joy of Christ after Mass. One woman mentioned to me how she had never experienced such a warm parish community before coming here. I am convinced this is the effect of Christ touching more people's hearts in the Eucharist.

It seems to me many have grown in their love for Our Lady. I hope the Novena to Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception was an important factor in that. Another thing which touched my hearts was seeing more parishioners recognizing the need for Our Lord's mercy in the sacrament of reconciliation, and knowing so many more children have gone to Confession with a greater frequency.

Having so much support and kindness shown makes being pastor here a true joy. When I think about over these eight years, as a parish and a society we have faced many things but through it to see some extraordinary responses among parishioners. I want to thank all of you for all you have done and I pray you will continue to grow in your love for God and neighbor in the many years ahead, especially through your life in Christ with the Church.

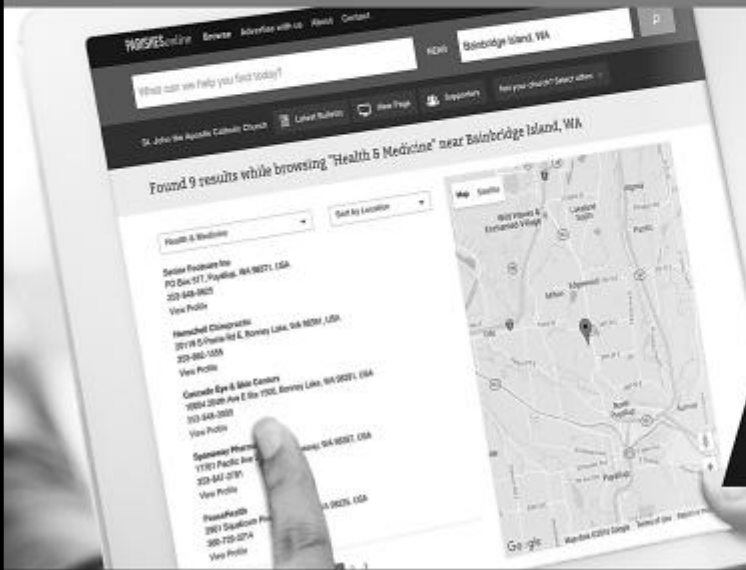
