History of the Image of the Last Supper on the Main Altar

For some time, I was giving thought to painting and improving the church. As you know, several years ago I made some simple changes that helped beautify the church and draw our attention more to the presence of the Lord in the Eucharist (moving the tabernacle to the center and the chairs to the side; putting up the Divine Mercy and Our Lady of Guadalupe images; purchasing older chairs in the sanctuary rather than the three that looked like something from Star Trek; taking off the Velcro decal that hung on the front of the altar and the five little wooden flowers underneath it and put on the new altar cloths that hung on the sides with some phrases in Latin; etc.).

Then, over time the church walls and sanctuary carpeting began to get dirtier and more damaged and I began to give a lot of thought to what we should do. I asked Jean Owings last Fall to think about colors for the church and with her help and others' help we came up with a plan. Slowly, ideas came together, and many ideas were bounced off others. In the midst of ideas coming together, I still felt there was something needed with the main altar. Then one day after Mass one of our parishioners, Karen Daley, approached me and I asked her about an image of the Last Supper she told me about years before. She mentioned how when the church was renovated in a more radical way back in the late 1970's, the high altar was dismantled and buried in the back of the church property. In that altar was an image of the Last Supper that she said she would love to look at as a young girl at Mass and helped her pray. But as they were removing it, her father, Robert Silva, asked Fr. Kirby if he could have it. It was given to him and he brought it to his house and placed it the basement of his house (the house to the right of the fire station). Over the years, several people owned the house and changed the house into different apartments, and through it all the image remained in this musty basement. There is sat for approximately 40 years. When I approached her about it, she mentioned how for some reason that image of that altar was on her mind (she did not know I was thinking about all these renovations).

One owner of that house, Marcel Sorel, a parishioner of Holy Family, just told me last week he owned the house for 19 years and was very careful with the image when he had to move it. One friend of his told him to smash it up and get rid of it and Marcel said 'no' because it was so beautiful and it was from the church (though he had no idea what to do with it). After I talked with Karen about getting the image even without knowing its condition, she talked to the current owner of the house (who is not Christian), who was very happy to hear the image was going back to the parish where he felt in his heart it belonged. Our plan was to get it and if it was in disrepair we would bury it, but if we could use it, we would. We came to find out the image was intact but it had one main break across the table of the Last Supper and the side molding was gone.

Trying to figure out how to repair it, I spoke with our parishioner Paula Yetman and asked her if she knew of anyone who did this type of work. Paula just had a woman named Patricia Brady join her confraternity recently. Patricia just moved to Massachusetts from out of state, joined Paula's group, and had just had mentioned to Paula she loves fixing religious statues and if she knew of anyone that needed any repaired to let her know. God's finger was at work on this project.

I went with Steve Woolson, Karen Daley, and her uncle to the house to get the image (even with the large break, the image was striking). But, as soon as we started to move it the whole image began to fall apart in our hands (most of it was made of plaster). It broke into about 7 or 8 major pieces and then many smaller pieces broke off that. Amazingly, the main characters did not break, but everything else crumbled. We brought it to the small garage of the church. I then asked Paula Yetman if she could talk to Patricia Brady about coming out to check out the completely dismantled image to see if she thinks it could be repaired. Patricia said she would come out and said we would also need a carpenter to help. I then remembered on our March for Life trip last January one man, Michael LaPlante from St. Nicholas of Myra in North Dighton, mentioned on the bus how he does carpentry work and even rebuilt the altar at St. Nicholas. So I called him to see if he would be able and interested, and he was. When Patricia and Michael met with me, I figured she would say it was not repairable, but amazingly she was up for the task.

Two weeks later the two of them began their work (neither one ever doing a project such as this) and two weeks after that we had a completed Last Supper. It was fascinating to see it come together at first like a puzzle, and then how they recreated all the missing and broken parts. Michael reinforced the whole image and then incorporated it into our existing altar. Then Sutton Fleming, whom we hired to repaint the altars and the lectern, painted it to have an antique look.

It is an amazing story of how an image that helped so many people over 70 years to pray on the Last Supper and the Eucharist was removed, others instinctively protected this image, and now incorporated into the changes that were made over the years. Amazingly, God moved different people's hearts to be in the right place, and using the gifts he has given them, to bring something back to the life of this parish. I hope in the years ahead all of you find this image to be another aspect in our celebration of the Mass and personal prayer to draw you deeper into contemplation of the gift that Jesus has given us, a share in his very life, the Eucharist.

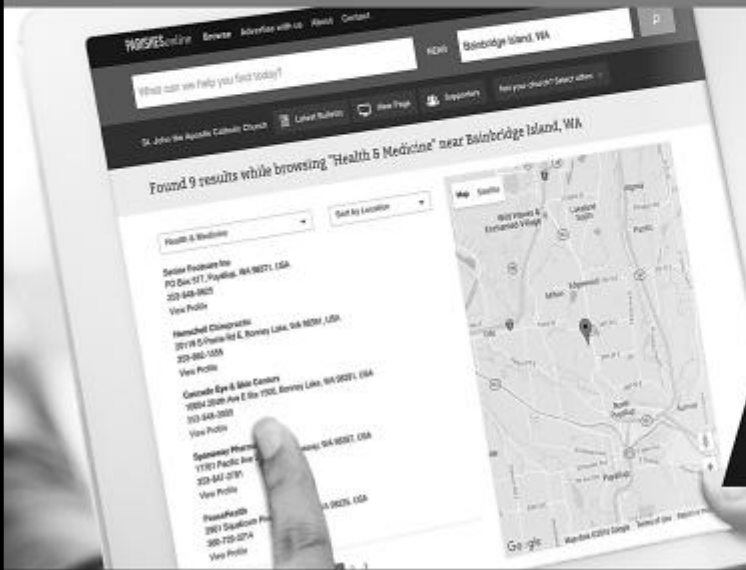
Permanent Diaconate Information Night This
