It's possible that all Jesus had to do was say, "Come after me" to get Peter and Andrew to drop their nets, leave their families, and become disciples. But

it's far more likely that this story is the climax of a number of other encounters Jesus had with them. This observation can teach us two things. First, our decision to follow Jesus is never a onetime choice. Second, our decision to help other people follow Jesus is never a onetime choice. Even if Peter and Andrew said yes at a moment's notice, their commitment to Jesus needed to grow. No matter how mature our yes is, the Holy Spirit wants to take it to a deeper level. He wants to help us mature in our commitment to him so that we can know him better and become more effective servants of his kingdom. Jesus is calling you to follow him and asking you to keep evangelizing people with love and compassion. Jesus has all the grace you need.
