From the Pastor: Thursday, October 5, was the feast day of Blessed Francis Seelos. Fr. Seelos was a native of Germany and was ordained in Baltimore in 1844. He served in parishes in Pittsburgh, Cumberland, Baltimore and Detroit before being transferred to New Orleans in 1866. He died on October 4, 1867 of yellow fever. He was beatified in 2000. The first miracle invoking him occurred while he was on his deathbed. A priest serving with Fr. Seelos in New Orleans had been injured as a child and this injury had flared up again as he was ministering during the yellow fever epidemic. Barely able to walk he knelt at Fr Seelos’ bedside and asked that God heal him through the merits of Fr. Seelos. He was able to walk immediately and actually celebrated Fr. Seelos’ Requiem Mass a few days later. Over the years, stories of his miraculous interventions began to spread. The miracle accepted for his beatification involved the 1966 healing of a lady in New Orleans who had been diagnosed with liver cancer. During surgery, her doctor had noted that 90% of her liver had been replaced by a tumor and she was sent home with two weeks to live. She visited Fr. Seelos’s tomb and prayed for a miracle. Five years later, during another abdominal surgery, her doctor observed that
