FEAST OF OUR LADY OF MT. CARMEL

Monday, July 16th is the Feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. Following the 6:00 p.m. Mass there will be enrollment in the Brown Scapular for those who have never been enrolled before. Enrollment in the Brown Scapular is once for life. Even if you stopped wearing the Scapular after having been enrolled, you need just begin wearing it again. Also, it is not necessary to have each new Brown Scapular blessed. If you are enrolled the blessing carries over to each new scapular. This is logical thinking as Carmelite Priests and Nuns do not get each new habit blessed or go through another clothing ceremony when their habit wears out.

Praying the Jesus Prayer

When you are in love, only one person matters to you, and that is your beloved. When your beloved is God, you must surrender to him. The self has to disappear. Prayer is this self-emptying. It means that we stand still and wait.

The Jesus Prayer might be enough for you. "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me, a sinner." Why would it be enough? Because it brings Jesus into your life. The repetition of the holy name brings the presence of the person, for in the Hebrew tradition, the name of a person *is* the person. Thus it says in the New Testament, "At the name of Jesus, every knee must bend." When you invoke the name of Jesus, you are drawn into his name, immersed in his name, immersed in him.

Don't try too hard to concentrate. You might be reciting the Jesus Prayer even though your mind is on a hat you saw a few days ago. You can continue saying the Jesus Prayer with a hat on your mind. You don't have to get all upset, saying, "That damned hat! I wish it would go away! It's been interrupting my thinking and my prayer for days!" You needn't worry about things like that.

Russian Christians don't know anything about yoga, mantras, special breathing, and all the prayers of the non-Christian East. Nor did the Greek monks—they prayed the Jesus Prayer naturally, and the Russians learned it from them. "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me, a sinner." In and out. You don't do it consciously; it just happens. This is the Jesus Prayer.

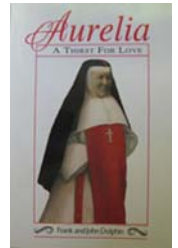

Here, a candle is always lit in their memory. All day long people stop to pray. On the first Monday of every month, our 12:15pm Mass is celebrated in honor of these children and for the comfort of their families. We pray that you will find peace in knowing that your child(ren) will be remembered at the Shrine and honored by all who pray here.

We will inscribe the names of babies who have died before and at birth in our Book of Life, and as always, we invite you to visit the Shrine if you are in New York City.
