LIVING OUR FAITH: Jesus Christ is Lord

St. Paul makes it sound so simple: have an attitude like Christ's. But what is that exactly? Ungrasping of any greatness, content with "human estate," empty of self and filled with humility, obedient to God even to death. Not quite so simple. But that is discipleship.

The opposite of a Christ-like attitude is an Adam-like one. The old Adam, as St. Paul writes, grasped at equality with God, not content to be human. The Adam-like attitude is full of self-importance, more hubris than humility, disobeying the creator in favor of a creature. Because of this, the human became mortal.

Let us look at the fate of the new Adam. Because Jesus received his humanity with grace, he is lifted up to the highest place. Jesus embodies his most repeated teaching, that the last will be first. Still we cling to our Adam attitude, struggling to get to the front of the line.

Questions for the week: *In what areas of your life are you most clinging to control, the sure sign of "grasping equality with God"? How can you begin to put on an attitude like Christ's?*
