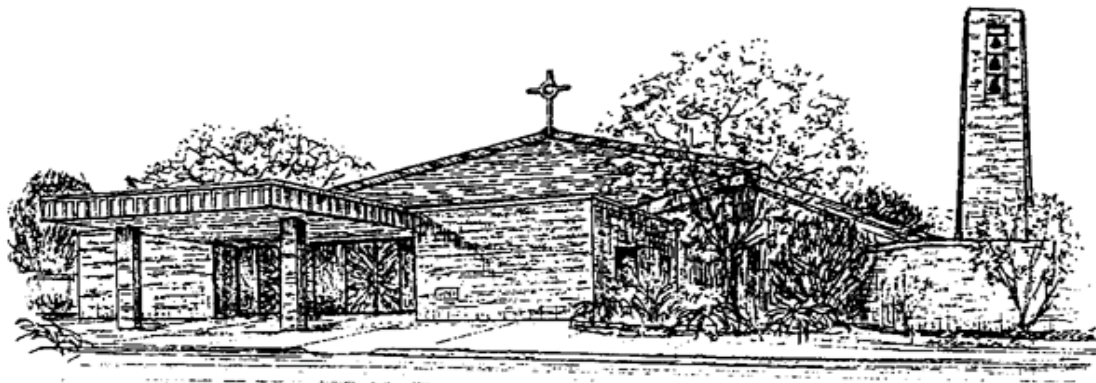

The R.C.I.A.



These four letters stand for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is a faith journey for adults desiring to become full members of the Catholic Church. Through a gradual process of prayer, faith sharing, study, and rituals, the R.C.I.A. process prepares people for full initiation within the Catholic

Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and/or Eucharist.

The R.C.I.A. process is designed especially for:

- Adults never baptized who might desire to become a Catholic.
- Adults baptized in another Christian church who might desire to become a Catholic.
- Adults baptized Catholic who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Please note that one of the qualifications to be a baptismal godparent or Confirmation sponsor is that he/she is a fully initiated Catholic, i.e., the person has received the Sacraments of Initiation of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

Formation sessions will begin in October, but please contact Fr. John as soon as possible at 201-891-4200 x280 or jjob.mbs@gmail.com, so that he can go over some of the logistics and answer any questions you may have.

2018 Sharing God’s Blessings: The Archbishop’s Annual Appeal

Through your generosity, we have surpassed (in pledges) our 2018 AAA goal. The goal was \$95,837. We have in pledges of \$103,970 with 260 families participating.

Now the work of the parish is to make sure those pledges are honored. To date, we have received \$86,865 toward those pledges. There is a balance to be collected of \$17,105.

If all pledges are fulfilled, then Most Blessed Sacrament Parish will receive 62% of all funds received over our assigned goal. At this point, that would mean MBS would receive a rebate check from the Archdiocese of Newark in the amount of \$5,042. We have included this amount as anticipated income in our fiscal 2019 budget. Thank you for fulfilling your pledges!

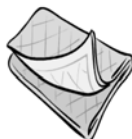

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

On September 16th, the third Sunday of September, the U. S. Bishops call us to recognize and prayerfully support the catechetical ministry as we celebrate Catechetical Sunday. The theme chosen for this year is “Enlisting Witnesses for Jesus Christ”. In each parish, those who are called to the catechetical ministry, as catechists, parish catechetical leaders, youth ministers, Catholic School religion teachers and leaders in our RCIA processes will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry among us.


Essentially, a catechist is a witness to Jesus by what they teach but more importantly, by how they live. Bl. Pope Paul VI who will be canonized next month, wrote an Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, published in December of 1975. It has been called the “Magna Carta of Evangelization.” In it he said, “Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses.” (*Evangelii Nuntiandi*, no. 41). While those called to the catechetical ministry are recognized in a formal way for their ministry today as we commission them, we are reminded that, because of our baptism, each of us is called to be a witness to Christ and his Gospel. By the choices we make and the way we live we are giving witness to our faith in Jesus every day, at work, at home, in our friendships and in our families, we all share in the mission of Jesus.

In our responsibilities as citizens we are also called to be witnesses for Jesus Christ in the ways we work to protect the earth and all who dwell in it, to protect those who are impacted by the abuse of the environment, those who are poor and marginalized, and the refugee, as well as those who are negatively affected by unjust economic systems. These, too, are areas where the Catholic Christian is impelled by the power of the Gospel to witness to Jesus Christ and His Gospel. It is the purpose of catechesis to draw us ever closer to Jesus and to a richer understanding of our Catholic faith which compels us to give witness and enlist others as witnesses to Jesus as well.

I wish to join with the faithful of the Archdiocese, as your Archbishop, in recognizing those who give of themselves so generously in fulfilling the call to witness to Jesus through the important ministry of catechesis in our parishes and schools. I extend my gratitude and that of the whole Church of Newark to our catechists, our parish catechetical leaders and our Catholic school teachers and administrators and pledge to them our support and our prayers.

May God richly bless you for your witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ.

SPOTLIGHT COURSES

The SPOTLIGHT program, sponsored by the Catechetical Office of the Archdiocese of Newark, offers introductory courses in Catholic teachings and scripture for adults. If you haven't had a recent opportunity to update your knowledge of our faith, consider taking a SPOTLIGHT course. Several courses focus on the main teachings of the Church as found in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. There are also courses on the Old Testament and the New Testament. Each course is completed in a single one day session on a Saturday, 9:30 AM - 3:30 PM. SPOTLIGHT is open to the general public. However, catechists, teachers and leaders in parish religious education programs, Catholic elementary schools, RCIA and adult faith formation are encouraged to earn doctrinal certification through these courses.

The following topics, locations and dates are offered this fall:

September 29, 2018

Spotlight on the Sacraments "Celebrating God's Presence" will be offered at Our Lady of Lourdes in Mountainside. The presenter will be Msgr. Paul L. Bochicchio, a retired priest of the Archdiocese of Newark who has served as Pastor at Holy Rosary, Jersey City, Our Lady of Mount Virgin, Garfield and Holy Family, Nutley.

October 13, 2018

Spotlight on Prayer "Church Alive: As the Church Prays" will be offered at Our Lady of Good Counsel in Washington Twp. The presenter will be Fr. John Gordon, a popular conference speaker and retreat director, serves as the Acting Vicar for Pastoral Life and the Coordinator of the Office for Evangelization of the Archdiocese.

November 10, 2018

Spotlight on The Old Testament "Ancient Stories Ever New" will be offered at St. Henry Parish in Bayonne. The presenter will be Sr. Barbara Moore, O.P., D.Min., a Caldwell Dominican sister, is an Associate Professor of Theology and Pastoral Ministry at Caldwell University.

December 1, 2018

Spotlight on the New Testament "The Word Enlightens our Faith, Fortifies our Hope, Inflames our Love" will be offered at St. Philomena in Livingston

The presenter will be Fr. John D. Gabriel, Pastor of St. Paul Church, Ramsey and priest of the Archdiocese of Newark for over twenty-five years.

Additional courses on scripture, morality and the creed will be among those offered in the spring. Registration is \$40 per person per course, which includes a light breakfast and lunch.
