The Desire for Wisdom

There are many things we can possess. Advertisers remind us of this hundreds of times every day. When we read the morning news, ads borrow the attention of our eyes. - **Sometimes we just want to yell. Maybe a family member or a friend has messed up, and we want to “set them straight.” Start counting.**
