Quelques paroles de Monsieur le Cure

The young man looked at the handkerchief in my hand and laughingly told me how he used to mispronounce the word when he was a child. I smiled at this confession from the innocence of his childhood.

Then he asked me what I used a handkerchief for. When I had answered his question, he asked me why I did not use a tissue.

It was one of those moments when I felt like a troglodyte.

A short time later in the course of a conversation, a parishioner expressed the hope that the next pastor here would be a younger priest. I chose not to ask the reason for the wish because I did not want to know.

Perhaps, I thought to myself, I am past the stage of being a troglodyte. I began to wonder if I was not moving into obsolescence.

Is planned obsolescence restricted to design and economic theory or is it possible that planned obsolescence is a part of the human experience?

Admittedly I do not do as well as I did formerly on the periodic cultural IQ test. I basically have no interest in music, have not watched a movie in years, and am indifferent to Hollywood. I do read contemporary novelists, mostly James Lee Burke, Jonathan Kellerman, and John Grisham.

Nonetheless, I do very poorly on the cultural IQ test.

Despite my limited knowledge of their culture, I think I still relate relatively effectively to children and teenagers. I could be deluding myself. Is that another sign of obsolescence?

Upon further reflection, I have concluded that I am not obsolete because humanity never becomes outdated or useless. Cultures can and do change. Actually they must change. Styles and customs need to be fluid. Humans who depend on a culture for the means of expression and fulfillment do not experience the same type of change. Authentic human change is one of depth, not perception. The simple truth is that the deeper our experience of being human, the deeper the bond with others. The adage holds: that which is most personal is most universal.

Therefore I will continue to use a handkerchief and a typewriter, avoid music and movies, and wear my standard clerical attire. I will dabble in cultural matters and find joy there. And I will never be obsolete because my humanity continues to deepen.

On the other hand, the next parish priest, and I hope that day is far in the future, will definitely be younger than me because there are very few who are older than me.
