I am rather hastily composing these few words because I have a few other tasks to do, all of which needs to be completed within the next few hours. It is that time of the year as well.

This is a baseball and softball community. Many of you have already begun the summer competition and are traveling on the weekends for games. The occasional visiting teams will find their way to Mass here between now and the end of June.

It is a busy time, but it can still be an opportunity as well to experience growth as individuals and as a family.

The important thing is to keep the Lord Jesus as the center and the source of life. This means keeping Him in mind and heart as we go about our daily lives. This is a challenge, but not one as difficult as some may initially think.

For example, I enjoy baseball games at this time of the year, even though I know precious little about the sport. I do appreciate the talent of the players and the skill of the coaches. Weather wise, the early days of the season are a delightful time to be outdoors.

But I also know that the Lord is present at these games. For me, it is an opportunity for another time of prayer because I know He is present.

It is not the same as my daily prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in church. This prayer before the Eucharist is enveloped in silence, even when the silence is shattered by those who perhaps consider themselves the great conversationalists of the era.

It is not the same as the prayer of the breviary, that collection of biblical readings assigned to priests each day. This type of prayer involves reflecting and proclaiming the Word of God on behalf of all humanity.

The silence needed for personal prayer is appropriately replaced by the various voices of the participants and spectators at the game. The Eucharistic presence is replaced by His presence in the players, coaches, fans, and the officials.

The humanity on whose behalf I pray the breviary each day is right before me. These are a part of the humanity for whom I pray. Seeing them, I often renew my prayer for specific individuals who have asked that I pray for them.

This is only an example. The same dynamic can and should be a part of how we as a people of faith live our daily lives.
