Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

### **The Sacrament of Baptism**

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

### **Baptismal Preparation**

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

### **Sacramental Sponsorship Letter**

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

### **The Sacrament of Marriage**

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

**Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date.** At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

### **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

### **Funerals**

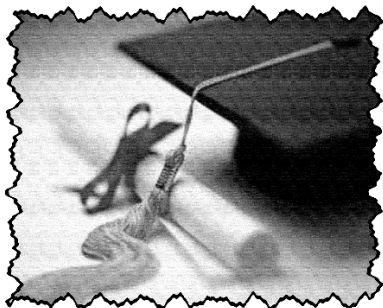

**Living the Good News Today**

*“For it is better to suffer for doing good...”*

I am always inspired by the messages that Pope Francis offers to the entire world, but most especially to Christians who look to Christ as the Light of the world. On May 15<sup>th</sup>, the Holy Father offered these words on his Twitter account: *“Let us ask for the grace to follow Jesus faithfully, not in words but in deeds, and to have the patience to carry our own cross.”* In this simple sentence, the pope reminds us that it will not be easy to “walk the talk,” because integrity and justice demand that our deeds must match our words. That is why St. Peter reminded the early Church in his epistle *“for it is better to suffer for doing good.”* We may not always earn compliments for doing good.

Coincidentally, May 15<sup>th</sup> was also the United Nations’ annual observance of the 2017 International Day of Families. This year’s event focused on the role of families in promoting education and overall well-being of their members. We first learn about goodness and morality in our homes through our families.

Last September, Philadelphia hosted the Church’s World Meeting of Families, which concluded with the visit of Pope Francis to Philadelphia for the closing liturgy. The family is the basic unit of society. No matter where people live, all families face various challenges that test them. It is especially more difficult for families to thrive where there is acute poverty, famine, or violence (e.g., war, organized crime/gangs, or government corruption).

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) partnered with two international relief agencies (LUMOS and Maestral International) to submit a proposal to the MacArthur Foundation for a \$100 million grant over a six-year period. To strengthen families, they focused on the theme “Changing the Way We Care.” As part of their proposal, CRS had to make a problem statement: *“Poverty, disease, and natural disasters have driven millions of children out of family care, with an estimated eight million now living in residential care centers, or orphanages, around the world. Residential care causes long-term negative effects on children’s physical, intellectual, and psychosocial development. Well-meaning people donate millions of dollars to orphanages without realizing that 80 to 90 percent of these children have a living parent.”*

In February, the MacArthur Foundation announced that CRS had been chosen as one of eight semi-finalists for the grant. Each of the other proposals offered an approach to different world problems. There were more than 7000 registrants who submitted 1904 proposals for consideration. Of these, 801 passed the Foundation’s initial review. After selecting the eight semio-finalists, Julia Stasch (MacArthur Foundation

President) noted: *“These eight ambitious proposals exemplify the passion, range, and creativity of the hundreds of applications. We hope that the competition inspires individuals and organizations to be bold and think big, because solutions are possible.”*

I listened to the CRS video on their website to be inspired by this project. As the team noted that 80-90% of children who are institutionalized in orphanages have a living parent, they expressed concerns for the long-term weakening of the child’s human potential. CRS had a vision of an alternative way of protecting children that allowed them to stay in the constructive circle of a nurturing family:

- Supporting parents/caregivers to be able to care for their children;
- Helping orphanage staff transition to providing family and community services; and
- Working with donors to direct their philanthropy towards supporting children in families as opposed to residential care.

When we experience suffering or witness the suffering of others, the experience appeals deeply to our faith to find courage and strength. It also compels us to act with conviction for the good of others. The founder of CRS’s partner LUMOS was J.K. Rowling, the internationally known author of the Harry Potter books. After reading an article in a British newspaper that revealed small children being caged in cribs in orphanages, she raised 1.95 million British pounds through the sale of a book to launch efforts to ensure that it would be a global priority for babies to bond with loving parents in a safe and stable environment rather than have parents believe that orphanages were their only viable recourse. Maestral International, the other partner to CRS, likewise has a vision statement for a world *“where every child is able to reach his or her full potential.”*

The eight semi-finalists have much work ahead. The MacArthur Foundation will reduce the competition to five finalists in September. We must pray and support CRS in this undertaking, knowing that in every outreach undertaken by CRS, the focus has always been on following Jesus faithfully—deeds that match the Word of God. In this weekend’s Gospel, Jesus reminds us that those who love Him will keep His commandments (to love God and to love one another as He loves us). If we suffer for doing good, we know that we have made the better choice—always—because Jesus has assured us that:

*“I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you.”*
