Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

Funerals

In all cases, the family of the deceased parishioner should contact the funeral home directly. They will contact the Church to make further arrangements. For information regarding our Parish Cemetery, please call the Cemetery Office at 609-702-1848 ext 304

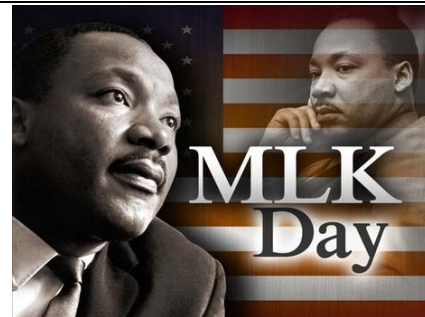

Living the Good News Today

"Constantly seek His face."

During the month of December, I facilitated a session on the sacraments for our parish's six RCIA candidates. The candidates' shared journey is one of initiation. As adult candidates, they have a greater probability of understanding that their initiation is only **the beginning** of something wonderful, transformative, and ongoing that happens to a person with faith.



This is what we share this weekend when we hear the Gospel story of Anna and Simeon, waiting patiently in the temple in Jerusalem and hoping to see God's promises fulfilled. They cherished the words in this weekend's responsorial psalm to "*Look to the LORD in His strength; constantly seek His face.*" At God's appointed time, they literally did see the face of God in the infant presented by Mary and Joseph!

During our RCIA class, we talked about the many ways that we have in our daily living to allow God's grace to enter. Are we as attentive to our spiritual life as we are to our: careers and job skills; listening to the news, both local and global; health awareness and physical conditioning; political interests; participating in or following sports; hobbies, memberships, and interests; entertainment, such as music, theater, games, and social media; and many other things that require our time and attention?

As a Catholic, there is a great resource offered by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) to reflect on our faith regularly and to get involved: Catholic Relief Services (CRS). While it may appear too simple that CRS is part of the Church's *Caritas International* network, providing disaster relief and great assistance to the poor and needy in developing countries, CRS allows each visitor to grow in faith through global solidarity. On the CRS home page (www.crs.org), there is a link called "*Get Involved.*" Besides making monetary donations to CRS that make a global impact, this site helps us to learn about what is happening in the world and asks us to pray. The CRS resources for prayer are powerful and inspired by the cultures of the people whom we serve as well as the liturgical cycle of celebrations.

Because I signed up to receive CRS updates by e-mail, I recently received an invitation to pray the rosary in a special manner during Advent. As I read through the Joyful Mysteries, I was delighted to see the Scripture reading for each of the meditations, connecting it to a fruit of the Holy Spirit, and then a beautiful reflection on refugee people who are living today in the holiness of life

and grace-filled challenges as did the Holy Family of Mary, Joseph, and Jesus.

In the introduction to this prayer for others, CRS shared this invitation to the faithful:

"By meditating on the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary, we accompany Mary and Joseph as they learn that Mary will bring the Son of God into the world, and we journey with them through Christ's birth and into His childhood. These reflections on each of the Joyful Mysteries include a story of refugees today in the Middle East, where the Holy Family was from. We reflect on the experience of the Holy Family through the stories of these refugees. Along with your personal intentions, please offer the Rosary for the safety of refugee families around the world, and for an end to the conflict and conditions that force people to flee their homes." Each of the five reflections on the Joyful Mysteries shares a story with us about real people whose names and photos are included, allowing us to embrace people living in the year 2017 who have faced the same difficult circumstances as the Holy Family. Before introducing the next mystery of the rosary, each mystery concludes with these little prayer intentions:

1. **PRAY:** *Mary and Joseph, we ask for your intercession for all expectant mothers and fathers everywhere, and especially mothers who will give birth while on the road, in refugee camps or in places far from home.*
2. **PRAY:** *We pray that even when our hearts are filled with our own joys and hardships, we will remember to reach out to and love our neighbors.*
3. **PRAY:** *We ask the intercession of the Holy Family as we pray especially for all refugees who are raising their families on the road without basic needs and the comforts they once had.*
4. **PRAY:** *We pray that during the season of Advent [Christmas] we will see Christ in those around us, especially in the gift of children.*
5. **PRAY:** *We pray for all refugee children, especially those separated from their parents or who have died on their journeys to safety*

Just like Abram in the Book of Genesis, Mary and Joseph "*put his [her] faith in the Lord.*" From the moment of the Incarnation of Jesus, Mary and Joseph faced decisions and commitments that tested their faith. For the fourth mystery (the Presentation), the CRS fruit of the Spirit is "*purity of mind and body.*" How pure were the hearts and minds of Anna and Simeon, who sought the Lord in their long lifetimes and saw God! May the prayers of this Christmas season be our gift!

"Rejoice, O hearts that seek the Lord."
