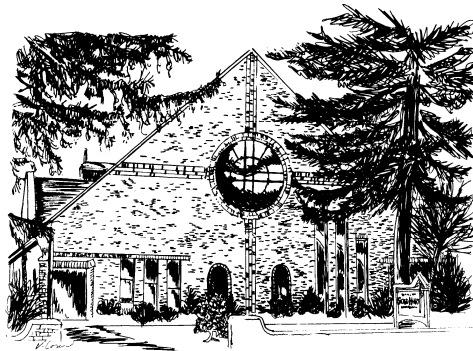

Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

INTRODUCTION TO THE BIBLE

Catholics are often reluctant to begin reading the Bible, this for various reasons. Perhaps we hang on to the notion that the Bible is a book meant for display, for recording the dates of family members' births, baptisms, marriages and deaths. Or perhaps we once attempted to read the Bible and discovered there a culture entirely different from ours – and came to the conclusion that the Bible had nothing relevant to say to us in this place and time. Perhaps we're of a generation that remembers being told not even to read the Bible because we wouldn't understand it or it could confuse us about our Faith. And there may be other reasons why we shy away from this wonderful and empowering book.

In this supplemental Bible study facilitated by John Madden, M.A. in Theology and Ministry, we will use a splendid commentary by Stephen Binz that will offer practical explanations that make the Bible less foreign and more familiar. You will discover how the Bible came to be, how to choose a Bible translation, how to interpret the Bible within Catholic tradition, and how to benefit the most from Bible study.

All members of the parish are invited to participate but we extend a very special invitation to those members who have come into Sacred Heart through our RCIA program recently and over past years.

The program extends over six sessions. Materials consist of a Commentary and Study Guide, which will be distributed at the first session. Participants also are encouraged to bring to class their own Bible to supplement the materials.

The Lost Horizon Project

As we begin the winter season, there is no doubt that the time for snow, frost, wind, long dark nights are upon us as we begin the new year. It is time for the 'read the book - see the movie winter project' and this winter's offering will be perfect to cover-up with an afghan and enjoy a hot beverage. This winter we will read James Hilton's wonderful story about a place called Shangri-La. It is a story that involves adventure, fantasy, drama, romance - with a major spiritual twist, *Lost Horizon*. I have been thinking about offering *Lost Horizon* ever since we covered the book, *The Life of Pi*, several years ago. There may be a strong connection in both stories. The connection may be *the gift of our imagination*.

Imagination is that powerful part of us that each of us has and the degree to which we use this gift can add much dimension to our lives. As we go through the humdrum of daily living...of working, studying, paying the bills, attending meetings and so on, there very well may be a place that we would like to escape to? A place called Shangri-La? In his classic novel from 1933, British author, James Hilton provides the place and all that we have to do is join the group on that particular airplane. Are you ready to come on board? I hope so.

Living the Good News Today

"Come, and you will see."

Because of the holiday printing deadline, I submitted my Dec. 31st bulletin input before the MacArthur Foundation announced the recipient of the "100 & Change" \$100 million grant, for which the US Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Catholic Relief Services (CRS) was one of four finalists. On Dec. 20th, press releases disclosed that the \$100M grant was given to the *Sesame Workshop & International Rescue Committee* to educate young children displaced by persecution and conflict in the Middle East. Over the next five years, these children will benefit from this grant through the creation of a *Sesame Street* program designed with Muppet characters speaking local languages to stimulate intellectual and emotional development.

It must have been very difficult to be part of the MacArthur Foundation review board and make the final choice. For example, the CRS offer was focused on new approaches to reunite children in global orphanages with their natural parents and to help them thrive in society. What a blessing to read that the MacArthur Foundation had decided to award grants of \$15M each to CRS and the other two finalists! Cecilia Conrad, MacArthur's Managing Director who leads *100 & Change*, summarized the announcement:

"Collectively, these projects identify the opportunity for action to improve long-term prospects for the world's children. They propose feasible and durable solutions to remediate the effects of family and community disruption, the lack of dietary diversity, and premature birth. All four projects proved worthy of MacArthur's support. MacArthur is deeply committed to helping all of them attract the support their critical work requires and finding partners to realize these impactful solutions."



This weekend, the Church observes the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time with a Gospel story about Jesus. John the Baptist watched Jesus walking by and told two of his disciples, "Behold, the Lamb of God." After hearing this, they followed Jesus and asked Him

where He was staying. Jesus replied, "Come, and you will see." As Christians, we must also have this determined curiosity to know Christ better and to see Him wherever He is. We will be amazed at what we will find!

On Christmas Day in Rome, Pope Francis delivered his annual *Urbi et Orbi* message to the world. The Holy Father expressed a core theme: "Christmas invites us to focus on the sign of the Child and to recognize Him in the faces of little children, especially those for whom, like Jesus, 'there is no place in the inn.'" (Lk 2:7). Referring

to the Church as a "pilgrim in time," Pope Francis spoke very clearly about where we will see Jesus in our world today"

- *in the children of the Middle East who continue to suffer because of growing tensions between Israelis and Palestinians;*
- *in the faces of Syrian children still marked by the war that, in these years, has caused such bloodshed in that country;*
- *in the children of Africa, especially those who are suffering in South Sudan, Somalia, Burundi, Democratic Republic of Congo, Central African Republic and Nigeria;*
- *in the children worldwide wherever peace and security are threatened by the danger of tensions and new conflicts;*
- *in the children of unemployed parents who struggle to offer their children a secure and peaceful future;*
- *in those whose childhood has been robbed and who, from a very young age, have been forced to work or to be enrolled as soldiers by unscrupulous mercenaries;*
- *in the many children forced to leave their countries to travel alone in inhuman conditions and who become an easy target for human traffickers.*

The Gospel tells us that one of the two disciples who went with Jesus was Andrew, who then came back with his brother Simon Peter. Many people would come and see Jesus as time went on, and their lives would be forever transformed. What does Jesus want us to see? Are we looking purposefully for Him? Will we see something wondrous if we hear the call of Pope Francis to see Jesus in so many unlikely situations?

Even though CRS did not receive the full \$100M grant, I believe that God is working through all four of the finalists who received grants from the MacArthur Foundation. We can count on CRS to see Jesus in every labor of outreach, whether it is developmental or related to disasters.

With the hope of greater fraternity and solidarity in the world, bringing joy and hope to everyone, the Holy Father concluded his *Urbi et Orbi* message by saying: "And may we commit ourselves, with the help of His [Christ's] grace, to making our world more human and more worthy for the children of today and of the future."

For about 16 days, our parish feasted upon the beauty of the large Fontanini Nativity set on the altar steps. The gazes of Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the Magi shared with us the awe and wonder that was experienced in Bethlehem so many years ago when they saw Jesus for the first time—the love of God revealed to us. Now, Christ calls us to see Him in our own time and place in history. So, let us pay closer attention and, like John the Baptist, Andrew, and Peter, share what we have seen:

"Behold, the Lamb of God."
