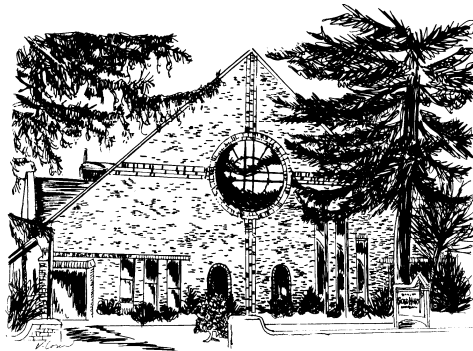

Parish Registration

Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

FEDERAL DONOR RECORDKEEPING RULE ON CHARITABLE DEDUCTION

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 included a section relative to charitable deductions.

The rules require that people claiming charitable deduction back up those deduction claims with cancelled checks; records from banks or credit card companies; or written notices from the charity or not-for-profit institution. The burden is on the donor to maintain or obtain the required records.

The parish will provide a record of contributions, upon request, which will satisfy the IRS requirements. Contributions of cash can only be used as a deduction if church envelopes are used enabling the parish to identify the donor. THE SEASON OF LENT

During the holy season of Lent, from Ash Wednesday, February 14th, to Holy Thursday, March 29th, you are strongly encouraged to participate in Mass and receive Holy Communion daily, to receive the Sacrament of Penance, to attend Lenten devotions and the Stations of the Cross, to read the Scriptures prayerfully, and to perform acts of self-denial and works of mercy.

PRAYER:

Daily Mass is celebrated at 7am & 8:30am. Weekend Mass and Confession times can be found on the front of the bulletin.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Novena is held every Wednesday at 7:15pm in the chapel. Stations of the Cross are held at 4pm & 7pm every Friday during the Lenten Season.

Eucharistic Adoration is Monday through Friday from 9am to 9pm in the Parish House Chapel.

FASTING:

The days of fast and abstinence are ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY.

The other Fridays of Lent are DAYS OF ABSTINENCE.

SERVE WITH JOYFUL HEARTS

The Book of Job teaches us how to deal with suffering, to have the faith to realize that the ways of God are far beyond our ways. As the good news is freely given to us by God, so too, Paul displays his faith in divine generosity. He freely gives to the Corinthians by refusing the stipend that was due to him in return for his ministry among them.

Jesus, as Healer, responds with compassion in today's gospel and heals Simon's mother-in-law who is then ready to fulfill her family/social obligations.

What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus? Job – Paul – Jesus each teaches us how to serve each other with joyful hearts. When we find gifts of God in our lives this week, may we give thanks to God, knowing that the gift is not an end in itself but to be given back to God in service.

Even though you may have found the Super Bowl stimulating and exciting and you are thrilling over the Winter Olympics from South Korea, there is still time to join the winter book/movie project. So get your copy of Lost Horizon and come aboard the plane to the enchanted place called Shangri-La. You may not want to return. Of course, the four main characters are the key to James Hilton's classic story - a story that is partly romance, partly mystery, partly adventure, partly spiritual and partly fantasy. However, there is really a fifth important character that compels the reader to go deeper...much more deeper. It is the place called, Shangri-La. Thanks to James Hilton, Shangri-La has come to represent a place where all of us would love to go to and enjoy for a length of time, perhaps even forever. Think about it. The cemetery is owned and operated by the Church of the Sacred Heart of Mt Holly. Persons buried in Sacred Heart Cemetery must be Catholic or a relative of a Catholic. The cost of one full grave is \$900 and one cremation plot is \$500, which includes perpetual care. Terms are \$50 down and monthly payments until paid in full.

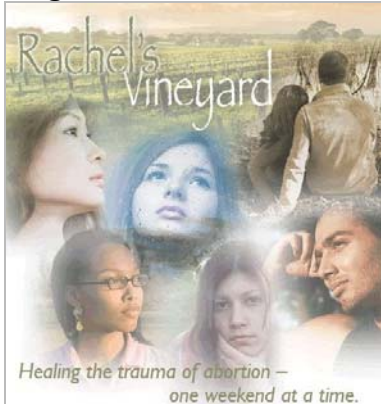

CENTERING PRAYER WEEKEND RETREAT
