The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- -If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- -Be at least 16 years of age.
- -Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- -Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,
During the days and weeks of penance that
lie ahead --- from Ash Wednesday,
February 14th until Holy Thursday, March

29th --- the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

1) The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below.

Valentine's Day falls on Ash Wednesday, February 14th this year. Since Ash Wednesday is one of only two solemn penitential days, no dispensations will be granted.

St. Patrick's Day, March 17, falls on a Saturday this year.

2) All other Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered serious.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent**,

February 17-18th^h **to Trinity Sunday, May 26-27th.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage Catholics to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

NB:

- 1) Ashes should be distributed in the proper liturgical manner and context. "Drive-thru" distribution of ashes is prohibited. If it is not simply a "drive thru" then it is not an issue.
- 2) Please instruct your parishioners concerning Lenten Regulations in your homily or announcements on the weekend of February 17-18th.
- 3) <u>Chrism Mass</u>: Please note that the Chrism Mass will be at St. Robert Bellarmine Co-Cathedral in Freehold, NJ on Monday, March 26th at 7:30 pm.
- 4) <u>Easter Vigil</u>: NO Mass should precede the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, March 31st. The Easter Vigil is observed after darkness (cf. General Instruction to the Roman Missal).
- 5) <u>General Absolution</u>: General Absolution is NOT permitted in the Diocese. Encourage individual confessions during Lent. Contact me if there is a concern.
- 6) Confirmation: In the case of baptized Catholics who are completing their Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil, priests who will celebrate the Vigil must request from me in writing the faculty to confirm, indicating in the letter the names of those baptized Catholics who are to be confirmed for our records. Priests already have the faculty to confirm Catechumens whom they baptize, and Candidates whom they receive into full communion in the Catholic Church.

THE SEASON OF LENT

During the holy season of Lent, from Ash Wednesday, February 14th, to Holy Thursday, March 29th, you are strongly encouraged to participate in Mass and receive Holy Communion daily, to receive the Sacrament of Penance, to attend Lenten devotions and the Stations of the Cross, to read the Scriptures prayerfully, and to perform acts of self-denial and works of mercy.

PRAYER:

Daily Mass is celebrated at 7am & 8:30am. Weekend Mass and Confession times can be found on the front of the bulletin. Our Lady of Perpetual Help Novena is held every Wednesday at 7:15pm in the chapel. Stations of the Cross are held at 4pm & 7pm every Friday during the Lenten Season. Eucharistic Adoration is Monday through Friday from 9am to 9pm in the Parish House Chapel.

FASTING:

The days of fast and abstinence are ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY. The other Fridays of Lent are DAYS OF ABSTINENCE.

ALMSGIVING:

Give of your time, talent and treasure.

THE SEASON OF PRAYER, FASTING, REPENTANCE, ALMSGIVING

On this First Sunday of Lent, the three readings are tightly linked as the metaphors of water and Baptism bring the three together and the Church begins its preparation for Easter.

In the brief Gospel passage, we find the "forty days" of Jesus' time in the desert. The symbolism of the number 40 is important in tradition. We remember the 40 years that the Israelites spent wandering in the wilderness on their way to the Promised Land, and now we begin to observe the "forty days" of Lent. "The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert" (MK1:23) helping us who now follow and pray in confidence: "Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from the evil one."

Jesus' model of prayer, lead us into silence and prayer and give us compassionate hearts.
