The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

During the holy season of Lent, from Ash Wednesday, February 14th, to Holy Thursday, March 29th, you are strongly encouraged to participate in Mass and receive Holy Communion daily, to receive the Sacrament of Penance, to attend Lenten devotions and the Stations of the Cross, to read the Scriptures prayerfully, and to perform acts of self-denial and works of mercy.

PRAYER:

Daily Mass is celebrated at 7am & 8:30am. Weekend Mass and Confession times can be found on the front of the bulletin.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Novena is held every Wednesday at 7:15pm in the chapel. Stations of the Cross are held at 4pm & 7pm every Friday during the Lenten Season. Eucharistic Adoration is Monday through Friday from 9am to 9pm in the Parish House Chapel.

Finding Our Way During Lent

Earlier last year, I had to drive somewhere I had been a few times before, but decided to use my GPS as back-up. This is partly because I have absolutely no sense of direction at all. For example, I once drove from Princeton with the aim of getting to Mount Holly, and ended up in Bethlehem, PA, crying on the side of the road and calling my husband who had trouble understanding how I could have possibly done that. (This is always the anecdote I tell people when I am trying to explain just how non-existent my sense of direction is.) For this particular drive last year, I did know where I was going “by sight,” but thought it would be a good idea to have my phone tell me where to go just in case, since I didn’t know the route well enough to just go on auto-pilot, which is never a mode I should drive in anyway!

My destination was about an hour away, and as I hit around the 45 minute mark of the drive, I suddenly realized I was really not on the right course. After pulling over and looking at the address I had put into my phone – very hastily – I realized that it was not correct, which added about a half hour to my trip. I ended up being late, which is something I cannot stand on an almost visceral level, and was really frustrated with myself because I knew that I should have known much earlier into the trip that I was not going in the right direction. I realized I had been solely relying on my phone’s GPS, so I just stopped paying attention to things I would have recognized along the way that would have been helpful in keeping me in the right direction.

I am embarrassed to admit this, but Advent felt a little like that to me this past year. (This is especially embarrassing when you are a professional “church lady!”)

Advent for me as a Catholic is one of my favorite liturgical seasons, as I expect it is for most of us. It was almost like I was “just along for the ride” this past year, and in simply showing up without paying close attention, and in not being prepared, I missed so much. Like the day I took that trip, I went into the season

unprepared and distracted by a million different things – ironically, most of them “Christmas-related” although admittedly in the secular sense for the most part – and I allowed my assumption that since I had a guide to follow in our liturgies and practices, I could just follow it and would get to the right place. This was another reminder that practicing my faith is not just about showing up, it’s about being in the right place spiritually, and paying attention. Because I was sort of on “spiritual auto-pilot,” I missed some of the things I normally love and cherish during Advent, such as the deeper connection I always feel with Mary, which has always especially been so important to me as a mother. I even missed attending any Simbang Gabi Masses, which has become just as much a part of Christmas for me as putting up our Christmas tree. My Christmas was still wonderful, but it wasn’t the same.

The silver lining though is that I am taking this lesson into Lent, another season when peace, prayer and personal reflection paired with the practice of our beautiful Catholic faith, can bring us closer to Christ in ways that deepen and enrich our relationship with Him. Ironically, because our faith traditions and practices are so reliable, it can be too easy to go through the motions without the “fully conscious, and active participation” to which Pope Paul VI called the faithful in *Sacrosanctum Concilium*. Paul VI was talking specifically about the Liturgy in that document, but I think it is just as applicable to the overall practice and understanding of our faith. Maybe if we – and by we, I really mean “I” – could come to our faith remembering that we are “a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people (1 Pet. 2:9; cf. 2:4-5),” we would more readily recognize the signs along our paths that are meant to lead us to Jesus, our true Destination. And in that way and in a certain sense, maybe losing ourselves in Bethlehem every year would be a good thing. ☺
