Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

God is calling each of us to become His witness and fill the earth with His praises. He wants to empower us to speak to the people in our family, our parish, our neighborhood about His marvels.

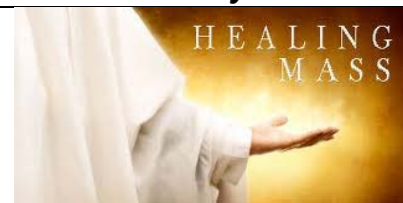

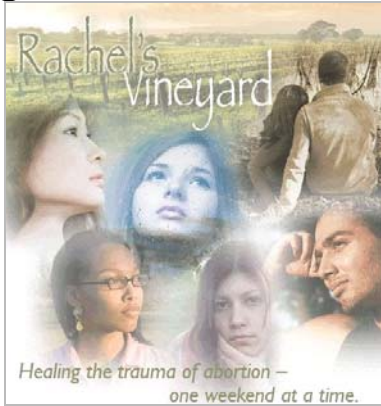

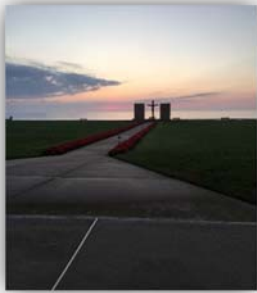

Living the Good News Today

"May the Lord be glad in His works!"

On this weekend of the Church's celebration of Pentecost (born of the Holy Spirit), our parish is commencing a special parish mission that will continue beyond the weekend's Masses into three consecutive weekdays of spiritual reflection with Passionist Brother Michael Moran:

On the Road: Walking through the Gospels & through Life
Our inmost being can be shaped and renewed by choices we make in committing our time to activities.

As part of both military and corporate leadership training, I was given some useful information regarding time-management decisions (both work and personal). The two keywords to keep in mind are "important" and "urgent." Two simple examples:

- (Urgent) *My house is on fire and I must take action;*
- (Important) *I'd like to purchase my own home someday, so I need to save a nest egg.*

There is no doubt that there will be many other decisions over the years that play out for that home or the savings. However, if we do not ever make things important, we may live in a chronic state of urgency.

Acquiring good time management skills means that we commit ourselves to discriminate between what is important and urgent. When we allow ourselves to become too busy, many things become urgent to us that have **no** importance in our lives. This is a waste of our time. It can lead to stress and anxiety. This is especially true in our spiritual lives, when our daily living can be so committed that it leaves little or no time for any "retreat" into God's sacred space.

Over the past eleven years, I have made seven mission trips to the Missionaries of the Poor (MOP) in Kingston, Jamaica. In addition to their vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience, the MOP brothers take a vow of service to Christ in the poor. Each day as we reported for our assignments with the brothers, we began the day with prayer. The brothers held prayer as "important" to the focus of each day.

After we fed the residents the midday meal, a brother would ring the bell, calling us to Midday Prayer in the chapel. Recognizing the importance of that bell, many of the residents, with simple smiles, lovingly escorted us to the steps leading to the chapel.

As the minutes of the day unfolded, there would be ample opportunities for the "urgent" to emerge: residents having seizures; fights breaking out among residents; a need for major plumbing maintenance; etc. At lunch one day, I mentioned to one of the young brothers that there was such a grace and energy that came to the community from their prayer life and it's intertwined service to

Christ. I will never forget his delighted smile when I shared that affirmation with him.

To an outsider or first-time visitor, the MOP ministry to the poorest of the poor (like St. Teresa of Calcutta's order) might seem too repetitive, daunting, and endless. For any community (even non-religious) that makes God the Center of their lives, though, the hope expressed in the responsorial psalm resonates, energizes, and transforms it:

"May the Lord be glad in His works!"

Like the early Church in the Acts of the Apostles, encountering Christ is important. The community was very deliberate about what was **important** to a vibrant faith life and how they lived as God's family.

Brother Michael sent our parish an outline with his themes for the three mission talks—a journey with Jesus that realigns our thinking and draws our hearts into that unity that St. Paul described to the Corinthians. The mission's themes celebrate the Good News of Jesus Christ—so timely for our world:

- ***Disconnecting*** from our quick-paced, technologically driven world deliberately and hearing the voice of God telling us we are the beloved when we are present with Jesus;
- ***Learning*** from Jesus' Cross that God loves us just the way we are, and it is this love that has the power to change us, to heal us if we are open and take the time for it to happen;
- ***Refashioning*** our memory of Jesus to give us courage, strength, and hearts burning within us.



Sometimes, we just need to splurge on ourselves spiritually. We frequently hear people talking about other pampering activities: getting a pedicure; going for a massage or to a spa; going away for a long weekend to a favorite place. The parish mission provides us an opportunity for getting away from what competes to waste our time and to use that time to be renewed by the Holy Spirit in God's loving Presence. This choice does not involve traveling very far or spending money. Essentially, though, it is about saying that our relationship with God is important enough to set aside other choices and to surrender to God's grace. Perhaps it even becomes sweeter to invite a friend or two to share this time and talk about it afterwards! ☺
