The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

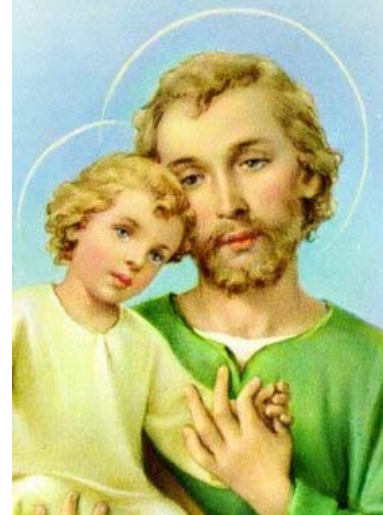

We Walk by Faith

In each of these Circle Project updates, we will look at what the reviewers have said about this very important story.

"Egger's work, part dark comedy, part sobering glimpse into the near-future, stuns for two reasons: Mae'e (she is the main character) humanity and compassion are apparent even as she helps erode our civil liberties; and two, it doesn't feel like science fiction. Living the Good News Today

"The just one shall flourish like the palm tree."

This weekend, we may find ourselves singing two hymns that are based on the Scripture readings: Marty Haugen's *We Walk by Faith* (from St. Paul's epistle to the Corinthians) and Bernadette Farrell's *Seed, Scattered and Sown* (Gospel reading). Both songs remind us that our lifetime pilgrimage as Christians requires great faith and a dying unto self, as we hold fast to what we believe, but do not see yet.

On June 7th, Franciscan Media, an evangelization apostolate of *St. Anthony Messenger* magazine, published a reflection on their *Saint of the Day* link for Blessed Franz Jägerstätter, a Secular Franciscan who gave up his life during World War II as a conscientious objector to the evil of Nazism. His short life bears great witness to the Scripture readings this weekend.

Franz was born on May 20, 1907 in Austria. His father was killed during World War I. When his mother remarried, his stepfather adopted him and saw to his education. He had a reputation for wild living and fathered a daughter out of wedlock. After meeting a deeply religious woman named Franziska, he turned his life around. They married in 1936 and had three daughters, sharing a serious commitment to living their faith. Franz happily became the sacristan of his parish church. On December 8, 1940, Franz professed to live the Gospel life as a Secular Franciscan.

When the Nazis came to power and sought to annex Austria, Franz, a simple farmer, was the only member of his community who voted against joining the Nazi accord. His vote was suppressed to make it appear that the village gave unanimous approval. Later, the Nazis drafted Franz and gave him some preliminary training. However, Franz deeply believed that cooperating with the Nazis violated his Catholic conscience. When he declared his moral reservations to the Nazis, they would not allow his preferred service in the medical corps. This would be a test of his faith.

While researching his book *Catholics and Hitler's Germany*, which was published in 1962, the American sociologist Gordon Zahn uncovered the story of Franz Jägerstätter. He was fascinated by the faith and determination of this young husband and father to resist evil, even in the face of death. He subsequently wrote a book just on him, published as *In Solitary Witness: The Life and Death of Franz Jägerstätter* (c. 1964). Despite Franz's strong convictions to oppose Nazism, he was encouraged by many people to consider the costs, especially to his family, and to consider compromising. He did not waver.

When the Nazis arrested Franz in March 1943, he was initially held in a prison in Linz, Austria, where a priest from his village visited to allow him further discernment

on what was the right thing to do. He remained steadfast in his position as a Catholic, even if it meant death.

During his imprisonment, he shared many letters with his wife. Not long after his imprisonment, he wrote to his wife Franziska:

"Easter is coming and, if it should be God's will that we can never again in this world celebrate Easter together in our intimate family circle, we can still look ahead in the happy confidence that, when the eternal Easter morning dawns, no one in our family circle shall be missing—so we can then be permitted to rejoice together forever."

In May 1943, the Nazis relocated Franz to a German prison in Berlin, where he faced trial for undermining military morale. When his attorney posed to him that other Catholics were serving the Reich, he made his position very clear:

"I can only act on my own conscience. I do not judge anyone. I can only judge myself. I have considered my family. I have prayed and put myself and my family in God's hands. I know that, if I do what I think God wants me to do, he will take care of my family."

Sometimes, it is difficult for contemporaries to see the fruits of faith in the immediate situation, but Franz was a living testament to what Psalm 92 describes, especially in the verse *"The just one shall flourish like the palm tree."* Perhaps his attorney was only seeing the finality of what was to come with this trial, but God would not ignore Franz's faith and fidelity.

After his conviction, Franz was relocated to Brandenburg-Görden prison to await execution. Between 1940 and 1945, the Nazis executed 2743 political prisoners at this facility. On August 8, 1943 (the night before his execution), Franz wrote his final letter to his wife:

"Dear wife and mother, I thank you once more from my heart for everything that you have done for me in my lifetime, for all the sacrifices that you have borne for me. I beg you to forgive me if I have hurt or offended you, just as I have forgiven everything... My heartfelt greetings for my dear children. I will surely beg the dear God, if I am permitted to enter heaven soon, that he will set aside a little place in heaven for all of you."

The next day, the Nazis beheaded Franz on the guillotine. His wife received his ashes in 1946.

Franz's life was a seed, scattered and sown. He still teaches us, like Jesus and St. Paul, to walk by faith, not by sight. Franz's wife and four daughters lived to see Pope Benedict XVI declare Franz a martyr for the faith in June 2007. They were also present at his beatification ceremony four months later. Those who walk by faith are the saints in our midst.

Through the sacred Scriptures and our Catholic tradition, we learn a simple priority of life:

"Lord, it is good to give thanks to You."
