Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

Good News Reflection

How to touch the hem of Jesus' garment

Wouldn't it be great if we could actually touch and feel the hem of Jesus' clothing, like the woman in this Sunday's Gospel reading? To be near enough to Jesus to be healed spiritually, physically, and emotionally. How can we, more than 2000 years after he ascended to heaven, get so close to him?

It is possible, and it's exactly what Jesus wants. It comes from developing a better understanding of who Jesus really is and how much God really cares about us. The synagogue leader understood, which is why he could say: "Please, come lay your hands on my daughter that she may live." He understood Jesus beyond what was in front of his eyes. He believed in the divine life of Jesus.

Knowing Jesus is to know divine life, which transforms our earthly life into something much more like his and then takes us to heaven. The first reading, remember, states clearly that death is not part of God's plan. Jesus drives this point home by allowing the girl to die before he reaches her house. Certainly God could have kept her alive until he got there! But he wanted to show the world that he could restore life and that he has the power to rescue us from death.

If we fear death, we don't recognize the nearness of Christ. We can touch the hem of his garment, but we don't see it, and so we don't believe it. In this case, we're like the mourners that Jesus had to chase out of the house before working his miracle.

If we fear that our trials are leading to disastrous conclusions, we've forgotten how powerful Jesus is, and we've forgotten that he cares enough to rescue us. We need to move ourselves closer to Jesus.

We have to press on through the crowd of distractions and doubts, with our eyes fixed only on Jesus and our hands reaching out to him in prayer.

If we fear that God doesn't care enough to help us, we need to spend more time learning why Jesus gave up his life for us and why the Father sent him to us.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

Do you believe that Jesus wants to work miraculously in your life? How has the disbelief of the people around you infected your thinking and reduced your faith?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

Describe a miracle that you saw or experienced. How long did it take? What blessings occurred during the time of suffering? How was all of this an expression of God's love?

Living the Good News Today

"Daughter, your faith has saved you."

When I graduated from eighth grade in June 1967, I spent the summer wondering what it would be like to start high school and to meet new students from other Catholic parishes close to Camden. When the first day of school finally arrived, there were so many unique new experiences: reporting to my freshman homeroom where we had been assigned alphabetically (in the course of the school day, this might be the only time that I saw these classmates); changing classrooms when the bell rang marking the end of a period; and having many different teachers, with their rules and expectations, for each of my subjects.

When I reported to my first religion class, I was curious to meet our teacher—a Catholic priest. After nine years at a Catholic grade school where the nuns taught religion, this was intriguing to me. After introducing himself, the priest told us that the most important book in our class was going to be our Holy Bible! We would also be using a Christian Brothers book series with our lessons plans. Our first assignment was a first experience for me: read the entire Gospel of St. Mark before our next class (we did have the weekend to read, after all)! 😊

As I read this Gospel and prepared for our class, I began to wonder why our teacher had chosen that Gospel. It did not begin with any story about the birth of Christ. I found myself anticipating every packed day in the life of Jesus Christ. When we gathered for class to talk about our assignment, I nervously waited to see if our teacher would quiz us on the many stories of visits, healings, parables, and confrontations that had occurred in this Gospel. Fortunately for our class, we learned one very important lesson: if we want to become true disciples of Jesus, then we will learn about Him and how we are to live from the Gospel. Father had opened our eyes, minds, and hearts to become people of God's Kingdom.



In this weekend's Gospel reading, St. Mark tells us two stories about faith. Both of these stories appear in Chapter 5 (about one-third of the way through his Gospel account of the life of Christ). We can find ourselves in those two stories, as we also share the experiences of wishing to be cured or of praying for a loved one or friend to be healed.

Even though the woman whom Jesus healed is not named, St. Mark tells us many important things about her that are remembered forever in her story:

- *She was afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years;*
- *She had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors;*

- *[She] had spent all that she had;*
- *She was not helped but only grew worse.*

What boldness and faith it took for this woman to approach Jesus, in a large crowd that was pressing upon Him, and believe that if she just touched His cloak, she would be healed!

Even when I read this story as a high school freshman, it stayed with me. I wondered what it must have been like for so many people to see what Jesus said and did as He went around Galilee, teaching and healing. Despite the crowd, Jesus was aware that power had left Him after the woman touched His cloak. The woman, on the other hand, immediately felt the cure of her affliction. What a moment it must have been when the woman heard Jesus asking who had touched Him, and she came forward to confess the truth! It is an enduring delight for us to remember this encounter of a hopelessly suffering woman with Jesus as He compassionately tells her, *"Daughter, your faith has saved you."*

St. Mark sandwiched that story, though, in between the request of a synagogue official to Jesus to come and lay hands on his daughter, who is near death, and the breaking news from that home that the daughter had died—no more need to trouble Jesus with a visit. Jesus is undeterred by this news, however. We can only imagine the scene at the synagogue official's house when Jesus and His three apostles arrived and found so many people in profound grief over the abrupt loss of a 12-year old girl.

There are so many challenges throughout our lives that require faith like the woman with the hemorrhage and the synagogue official. If we are not personally facing what might appear to be a crisis, we can become aware of others going through this because of the prayer requests that people make of us. As a community, we see how faith impels people to request prayers for: the sick of our parish; those who are in the hospital, convalescent centers, or surgical centers; loved ones who have passed away, and family members who are deployed in service to our country. Are we listening carefully to those prayer petitions every Sunday and reading the bulletin to see the other prayer needs? Do we appreciate the power of faith?

How often do we take time to read the Bible? The Sunday and weekday Scripture readings are an integral part of every Mass, providing us with wondrous insights into how God is continually working throughout history and our lives. This is what the reading from the Book of Wisdom shared with us: *God fashioned all things that they might have being.*

As we begin another week of **being** whom God calls us to be, the words of Jesus to the synagogue official can assure us that we are never alone:

"Do not be afraid; just have faith."
