

Praying the Rosary at St. Agnes

"Whatever you ask through the Rosary will be granted."

-The Blessed Mother to St. Dominic

Join us for the Rosary every weekday immediately following the 5:10pm Mass, where a parishioner will lead us. On Saturday, after the 12:10pm Mass, the Rosary will be led by a priest.

Our Lady revealed fifteen promises to St. Dominic (the Saint to whom the Rosary was first given in the 12th century) and later to Blessed Alan de la Roche (who re-ignited devotion to the Rosary in the 15th century) for those who practice the Rosary.

The Fifteen Promises of the Holy Rosary

- 1. Whosoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary shall receive signal graces.
- 2. I promise my special protection and the greatest Graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
- 3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against Hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
- 4. It will cause good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant Mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men [and women] from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for Eternal Things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
- 5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary shall not perish.
- 6. Whosoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself [herself] to the consideration of its Sacred Mysteries shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just, he shall remain in the Grace of God and become worthy of Eternal Life.
- 7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the Sacraments of the Church.
- 8. Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the Light of God and the plenitude of His Graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the Merits of the Saints in Paradise.
- 9. I shall deliver from Purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.
- 10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of Glory in Heaven.
- 11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by recitation of the Rosary.
- 12. All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
- 13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire Celestial Court during their life and at the hour of death.
- 14. All who recite the Rosary are my sons [and daughters] and brothers of my only Son, Jesus Christ.
- 15. Devotion to my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.

Praying the Rosary for Vocations: Pick up a brochure!

Praying the Rosary for vocations is an excellent way to help the Church. The Lord said, "The harvest is plenty, but laborers are few." He needs help! The word vocation means, literally, a calling. We are in desperate need for men & women to answer God's Call. Today, with a shortage of Religious, we must remember *there isn't a shortage of Calls*. There is,

rather, a shortage of those who Answer. Please pray for those who are Called. Pick up a copy of the "Rosary for Vocations" brochure in the narthex. It contains reflections on the Luminous Mysteries that support (1) The universal vocation to be holy, (2) Vocations to marriage, (3) Vocations for permanent deacons, (4) Vocations to Religious life, and (5) Vocations to the Priesthood. The Luminous Mysteries focus especially on the public ministry of Christ, so this Rosary is a simple but fruitful prayer for vocations.

St. Agnes expenses—we need help!

Did you know that St. Agnes offers Mass *thirty-nine times* every week? Or that our schedule for Holy Days of Obligation includes *eleven* Masses for the Faithful? That's a lot of work and a lot of maintenance to keep everything running smoothly. We have several important expenses that are vital to the daily life of our Church—our Friends & Parishioners. Please consider what you can give; donations can be placed in the collection basket at Mass or dropped off at the rectory. Have a question? Fr. Barrett is happy to address any concerns. What do we need help with?

Vestments & Linens

Quality vestments and linens are a necessity for a church that is as busy as St. Agnes. We really use these items and care for them well. We need to replace linens and priestly vestments, and they are more expensive than you'd think. A chasuble (the outer garment a priest wears to celebrate Mass), for example, costs a few thousand dollars! We need everyday linens and also special occasion (Christmas! Easter!) items.

Our Tabernacle

The beautiful Tabernacle in our sanctuary is in need of some major help—the locks are malfunctioning and if it cannot be repaired, it must, of course, be replaced. We have already looked into options and hope to be able to afford the best possible solution for everyone.

Fixing our Church Doors

St. Agnes needs help with the expense of repairing the front doors to our church. As these doors receive heavy traffic every day, the repairs necessary to keep up with our schedule are costly (over \$40,000!). We could not delay this work, and as you can see it is well underway.
