Total Consecration to Jesus Through Mary

For the 25th consecutive year, parishioners of St. Agnes are preparing for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, as developed by St. Louis Marie de Montfort. **The 33-day period of preparation begins on Tuesday, August 6th** (the Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord). The prayers are said personally and individually, and culminates on Saturday, September 7th, with the vigil of the Nativity of The Blessed Mother. **The Mass and Consecration at 12:30pm on Sunday, September 8th, the Feast of the Nativity of The Blessed Virgin Mary, will, however, be public for all who are prepared to make their Consecration.**

St. Louis Marie de Montfort—the proponent of this True Devotion to Jesus through Mary—proposed that, “the faithful consecration to Jesus through Mary is an effective way of living out our Baptismal commitment. It is giving ourselves entirely to the Blessed Virgin, in order to belong entirely to Jesus through her.” Mary is the most conformed to Jesus—and that the more one is consecrated to her, the more one is consecrated to Jesus.

The Benedictine Sisters of Saint Walburga Monastery, NJ



Who are we? We are monastic women who seek God in community through the Gospel and the Rule of Saint Benedict. We live our monastic conversion sustained by the Eucharist, the Liturgy of the Hours, lectio divina, and presence to one another. While some monastic communities are cloistered, ours is not. Therefore, we do participate in ministry outside the monastery, but try to find positions that are compatible with our monastic schedule.

What do we do? The Benedictine Sisters operate a pre-school, a high school, and host retreats at their Spirituality Center. The Benedictine Sisters of Elizabeth, NJ have been serving the people of the Elizabeth area since 1868.

Is God seeking you to journey with Him in a religious community?

Come listen to His call by participating in a Vocation Discernment Retreat with the Benedictine Sisters of Elizabeth. Experience the peace of a monastic atmosphere, join in the Eucharist, pray the Liturgy of the Hours with the Sisters, dialogue with other discerners, and reflect on what God is calling you to consider for your life. Typically, we look for women who are at least two years beyond high school graduation and up to age 55.
