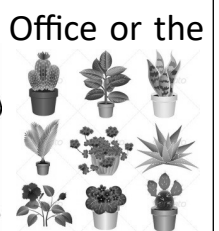


Examples of what we are looking for include items such as; homemade canned goods, breads, quilts, custom art/signs, propagated plants, succulent gardens, etc.
