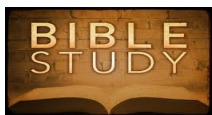

JUNE 9, 2019 - PENTECOST SUNDAY



Dear members of Blessed Sacrament family,

Greetings of Peace, Joy and Hope to each one of you!

This Sunday, throughout the world, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Pentecost. It is one of the greatest feasts in the liturgical calendar and it comes fifty days after Easter Sunday. When we go through the Acts of the Apostles, we see that the day of Pentecost marked a turning point in the early Christian Church. On that Sunday, many pilgrims had come to Jerusalem from all over the world. The Apostles and the Blessed Mother were gathered in the Upper Room, the same room where they had seen Christ after His resurrection and the same room where they had celebrated the Last Supper.

Christ had promised His Apostles that He would send His Holy Spirit, and it was fulfilled on Pentecost. The Apostles went out and began to preach the Gospel in all the languages. Many people who were gathered there from all corners of the world were converted and baptized that day. On that solemn day the Church was born. The frightened, disillusioned, sad group of disciples, through the power of the Holy Spirit became courageous, powerful and credible witnesses of Jesus.

All of us who have been confirmed, have received the gift of the Holy Spirit. Just like the disciples, on that first Pentecost, 2000 years ago, we too have received an outpouring of His gifts. The Bible reminds us, 'we have not received a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, love and joy'.

As we celebrate this great feast day, we should ask ourselves how we are exercising the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Are we spreading the Gospel and continuing the work of Christ within our families, our Church, our communities and our world? Let us use invoke the Holy Spirit, as we pray:

“Breathe in me, O Holy Spirit,
That my thoughts may all be Holy.
Act in me, O Holy Spirit,
That my work, too, may be holy.
Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit,
That I love but what is holy.
Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit,
To defend all that is holy.
Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit,
That I always may be holy. Amen.”
