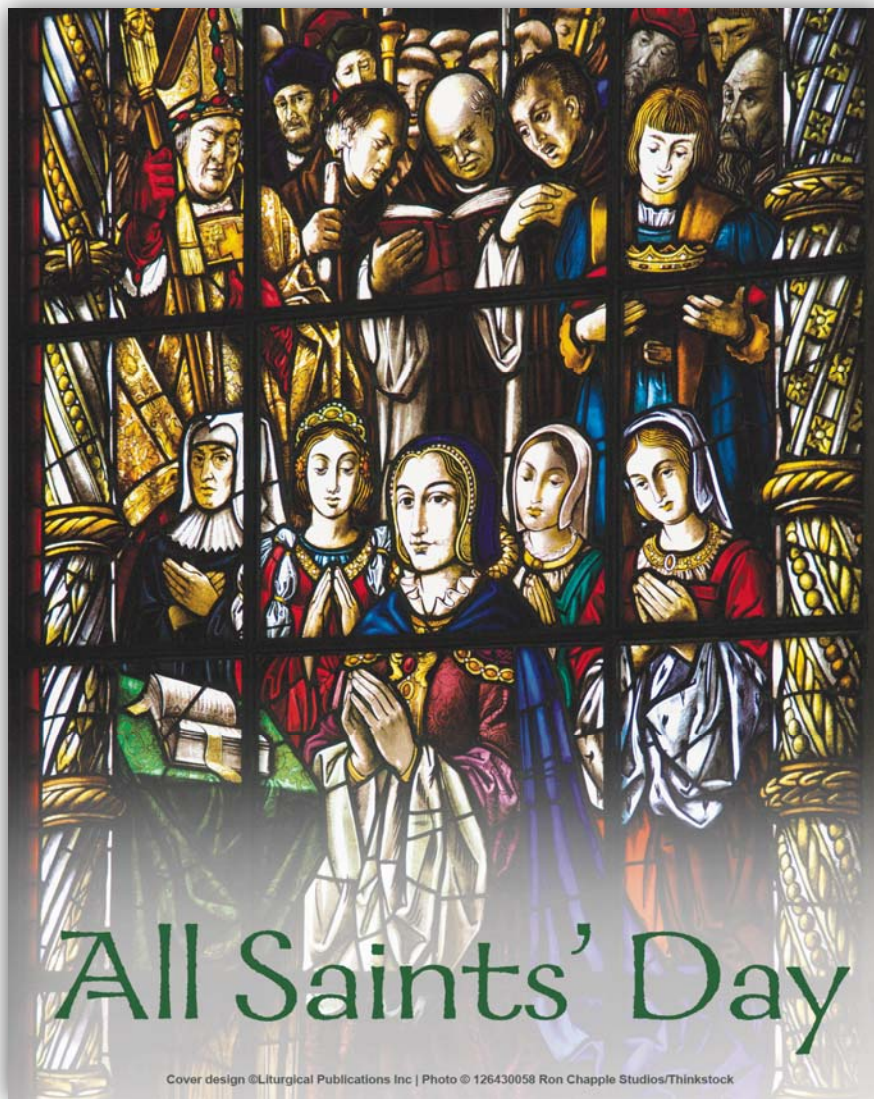

CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: ORDINARY TIME SAINTS

This Sunday as we continue through these last weeks of Ordinary Time, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints. The Feast of All Saints is a great reminder of how we are called to journey together and how blessed we are to have accompanying us those saints in heaven who are one with us in the Body of Christ.

The month of November has been declared by the Bishops of the United States as Vocations Awareness Month. In the church foyer you will find copies of 2015-2016 Vocation Posters along with prayer cards for Vocations to the Priesthood, Diaconate, Religious Life and Lay Ministries as well as prayer cards for Prayer for our Seminarians. We would encourage you to take a prayer card home and offer prayer as individuals and as families for our seminarians, and for vocations.

As you know, we also ask those visiting the Adoration Chapel to offer prayer for vocations to the priesthood.

We have a relic of St. Jean Vianney, patron of parish priests



in the entry room, as well as a poster with photographs of our seminarians near the entry door. We were happy to welcome to the parish Alex Ruch, a seminarian from Most Blessed Sacrament Parish, who is in Second Philosophy (second year college) at St. Joseph Seminary in Covington. Alex was here for the presentation of the

new poster in the Adoration Chapel. Alex shared with us a few thoughts before leaving: *"On behalf of all of the seminarians from our diocese, I cannot express enough how grateful we are for both the many prayers offered and the great support shown to us. Though you may not see our faces too often while we are away at the seminary, know that the Lord is indeed hearing and answering your prayers and that we are truly being prepared so as to humbly serve you as priests one day. I am convinced that if I truly understood the power of prayer, it would be overwhelming. Know of our continued prayers for each and every one of you, and may God bless us both as we continue this earthly pilgrimage towards our Heavenly home."* Let us keep Alex and those who are studying and being formed with him in our prayers. As you may know, we are blessed to have twenty seminarians in the seminary from the Diocese of Baton Rouge. While this is a great blessing, a lot of the

expense of their seminary Formation falls on the Diocese. We are happy to remind you of the Seminary Endowment Fund which we have here in the parish. An Endowment was established in memory of Brother John Keplinger, O.M.I, by Alex and Loretta Theriot who made the initial donation of \$100,000 to establish the Fund. Interest from this fund is given each year to the Diocese to assist in the education and formation of future priests who will serve in the Diocese of Baton Rouge. Parishioners who wish to add to this fund by means of memorial donations or remembering it in your will, are more than welcome to do so.

As we moved through October, I was happy to celebrate the birthday of another person whose vocation has meant

a lot to us in the Diocese of Baton Rouge and to me personally. **Msgr. William "Bill" Greene** celebrated his 90th birthday on the 14 October, and family and friends gathered to celebrate the occasion with him. He was my second pastor after ordination, and I served with him at St. Thomas More



from 1973-1976, when I was assigned to my first pastorate in New Roads. I brought a lot of what I learned from him to New Roads, and even here to Denham Springs. Among other things, it was with him I learned the importance of a consensus and have sought to reach consensus in every parish where I have served.

The Book of Remembrance has been placed near the Baptismal Font and Easter Candle,

and parishioners are invited to record the names of their deceased loved ones in the book. It will remain in its place (in the church or the main hall) through the month of November, and be removed November 28 as we begin the Advent Season. As we journey through this month of November, let us give thanks




for those saints of God who accompany us on our journey, and let us also pray for vocations. You can kiss your favorite pew goodbye as you leave today. Have a good and graced month. Love,

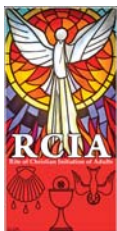

St. Vincent de Paul will offer holiday food baskets and a gift program for the needy. To apply, you must attend a screening session at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church. Those applying for the gift program for kids 12 and under must have custody and bring birth certificates, a list of what each child wants and the sizes of clothing they wear to the screening session. If you are unable to stand for a long time, please bring a portable chair.
