CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: ORDINARY TIME GRATITUDE

This Sunday as we continue through these last weeks of Ordinary Time, the Scriptures speak of the widow at the time of Elijah and the widow at the time of Christ, who both gave out of their need and have been mentioned and praised in the Scriptures ever since. Probably they never thought we would still be hearing of them in 2015. Generosity which is rooted in faith goes a long way. It was true then, and it is true today.

We offer a word of thanks and congratulations to Immaculate Student Ministry as they began last month having Tuesday (Jr. High) and Thursday (High School) sessions in the Youth Hall. They began on Tuesday in the refurbished Youth Hall with 30 Jr. High youth with a



program led by Amanda Milton and Kevin Acord called Noticing the Image of God in Our Lives. Both sessions begin at 7:00.

We offer a word of thanks to the Men's Club who continue the ministry of Mission Joy in our community.

As you may remember, in July we welcomed a number of youth from Immaculate Conception and surrounding parishes who did wonderful work in Eastover and other nearby communities. After the students left, the Men's Club, realized though they had done a great job, there was



still work to be done in the name of Christ. They accepted the responsibility of coming together and continuing the work of Mission Joy until next summer when the youth reassemble. They did clean up work and installed steps and a nice landing at a trailer in Plantation Oaks.

A special visitor came to see us as we prepared for the Fall Festival – Leo Barry is well known by many in the



parish, especially those who participate in the daily Eucharist. Last year, Leo and his wife, Patsy, moved to Covington where their son and daughter and their families live, so they could be near them. But Leo asked his daughter

if he could come visit with us for a while. It was like a great reunion as word spread he was here, and friends called other friends, and it was good welcoming him back for a while. Leo says he can walk to the nearby parish church in Covington for daily Eucharist, and still is able to participate. We thank Leo for his prayerful support, both when he was physically with us, and now that he spiritually joins us around the Lord's Table.

Stump the Pastor: I thought you would enjoy this question and answer. Many have asked why the roof of the pavilion addition is higher than the original roof. I was told that it was a matter of comfort. The slightly higher roof makes for better circulation and takes care of rising heat. I was told the addition is 8-10 degrees cooler than the original pavilion.

“You can have your cake and eat it too” is an expression we have heard often, but I thought of it a few weeks ago as we celebrated our Fall Festival. A few parishioners on Sunday almost apologetically said they had been praying for rain as it was so needed, but they didn't want to see the Festival suffer. The final figures aren't in yet, and I will be sharing some photographs next week, but it seems it was a success. Friday night was packed, the ride company said they had never sold so many advance tickets, we sold more \$10,000 raffle tickets than last year, one booth told me they sold more food Friday evening than all last year. We will see what the final figures say, but I am very grateful to Ronnie Dugas, our chairman and all who worked and came to make our Fall Festival a success. 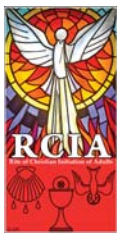
