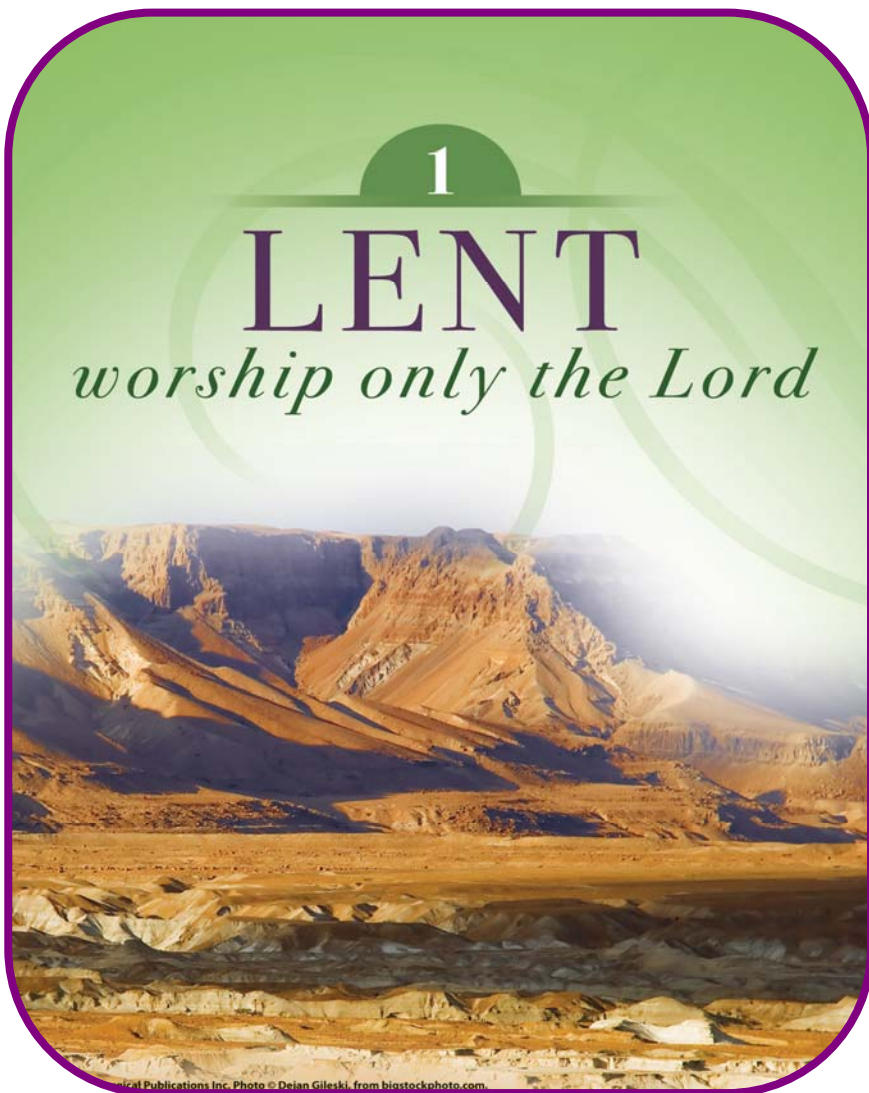

Stump the Deacon!

Can One Receive A Plenary Indulgence By Passing Through the Holy Door at the Cathedral?

Pope Francis has declared an extraordinary Holy Year of Mercy that began on December 8, 2015, and closes on November 20, 2016. A holy year is also known as a jubilee year. Among the privileges granted to the faithful during this Holy Year of Mercy is the opportunity to gain a plenary indulgence, which is the remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This indulgence can also be applied to the deceased—to whom, in the words of Pope Francis, “we are bound...by the witness of faith and charity that they have left us.” In the past, indulgences during a holy year normally required a pilgrimage to Rome and a visit to one of the papal basilicas, but for the upcoming Holy Year of Mercy, the pope has determined that a visit to a diocesan cathedral or designated local church will suffice, together with the reception of the sacrament of penance and Communion, as well as a profession of faith and prayers for the intention of the pope. (Pope Francis has taken care to extend the privilege to those who are precluded from visiting one of the designated churches, e.g., those who are homebound or incarcerated.) A unique element this time is that the pope has also granted the jubilee indulgence to those who perform the traditional spiritual and corporal works of mercy (sheltering the homeless, for example, or comforting the sorrowful.) As to the question about “multiple” beneficiaries, the jubilee indulgence may be obtained only once a day. (A single sacramental confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but receiving Communion and praying for the intentions of the pope are required for each indulgence.)

CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: PREPARING TO RESPOND

As we celebrate this **First Sunday of Lent**, the Scriptures remind us that Christ was tempted and had to decide what kind of Savior he would be, one who would take the easy route by working signs and wonders or one that would lead him by a more difficult and challenging route – one which meant accepting our human condition and all that is involved. In pretty much the same way, God continued through the centuries to ask the disciples of Christ what sort of Christians they would be. In the early Christian centuries, it often meant martyrdom, and down through the centuries saints have responded in many different ways.

This Sunday, the Father continues to ask the same question of us as he asked of the Son -

how shall we follow the Son in sharing what he came to share with us? This Sunday Stewardship of Ministry brochures will be passed out by the ushers after all the homilies, and we ask that you prayerfully take them home and respond to our need to have you join us all

in ministry in the Lord's name, by filling them out and returning them next Sunday during the Stewardship Commitment Procession.

EQUIPPED TO BUILD THE KINGDOM is the title of our Stewardship Program this year, and we have already celebrated commitments to Stewardship of Prayer and Finance, and we thank you for your commitments. We enjoy a great spirit of unity in our parish, serving with others, and ministering alongside those in the Diocese who assist us in so many ways. The heart of life-giving ministry calls for commitment and involvement from every parishioner. This is a calling and vital role for everyone in the parish. That is and always has been, God's plan for us. Just a few Sundays ago we heard St. Paul say, "Grace has been given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. Just like all those whose lives of faithfulness served our needs, so too are we gifted and called to honor Christ by

serving others through the many ministry opportunities that enrich the life of our parish. There are many programs, formal ones here, and informal ones which may cross your path on occasion. Please prayerfully fill out your Stewardship cards this week and bring them with you to church next Sunday so that you and your cards can be a part of our commitment procession. Thanks a lot for all you are and do.

Since September, when Pope Francis issued a document that initiated various reforms in the Church's procedures for determining the nullity of marriages, a lot has happened. Our local Marriage Tribunal, like Tribunals all over the world, had its challenges to determine how to best implement the procedures which Pope Francis requested. One of the easiest and first things to be implemented was that no more fees, requests for reimbursement for expenses, etc. would be requested. While there was never a "charge" for the annulment, there was usually a request for a "reimbursement for expenses" because of staff, postage, equipment, etc. Even if this was requested, if a person couldn't afford it, the annulment was never denied. But beginning in November, no fees, reimbursements, etc. were requested or even accepted if offered. This was easy, but then came the task to simplify forms and procedures. This was done by the Tribunal and the last week of January, I began submitting cases (three in one week) on new forms which made the process much easier and simpler for all. Of course, this will "speed up" the process, and while we have been given estimates as to how long it will take, I think (and so do they) it is not good to say too much concerning time right now. But I do think it will be a real blessing for all. I would like to invite any who feel the need of an annulment to call Deacon Rudy or myself so we can talk over the possibility with you.

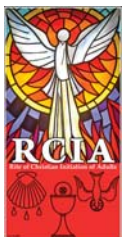

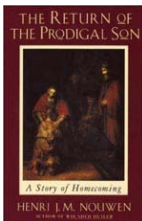
**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**

(Rite of Sending and Rite of Election)

None of us comes to faith without first being called by God. During this past year, the catechumens and candidates in the R.C.I.A. Process have been nourished by the Word of God, the teaching of the Church, and the support, prayer and example of our Catholic Christian community. *Their journey of faith began with a call from God.* They come before us today so that we, their faith community, may confirm God's calling them to begin the final period of their initiation into the full sacramental life of the Church. After the Rite of Sending, the catechumens and candidates will be presented to Bishop Muench at the Rite of Election which takes place at St. Joseph Cathedral in Baton Rouge this afternoon. It is appropriate for the Bishop to recognize them because he is the sign of unity of the particular Church, and it is the parish community's responsibility to bring those in RCIA into the fullness of the Church. The sponsors and godparents' roles are very significant; they represent the community and are asked during this Rite to make a public testimony about the catechumens. The decision of the RCIA participant to go through this Rite means that the judgement and decision-making about whether to enter the Catholic Church has ended. From this point forward, they are no longer catechumens but are called the "Elect". They will enter into the final period of preparation for initiation into the Church. After the Rite, they will be honored at a reception where they will be able to meet the Bishop.
