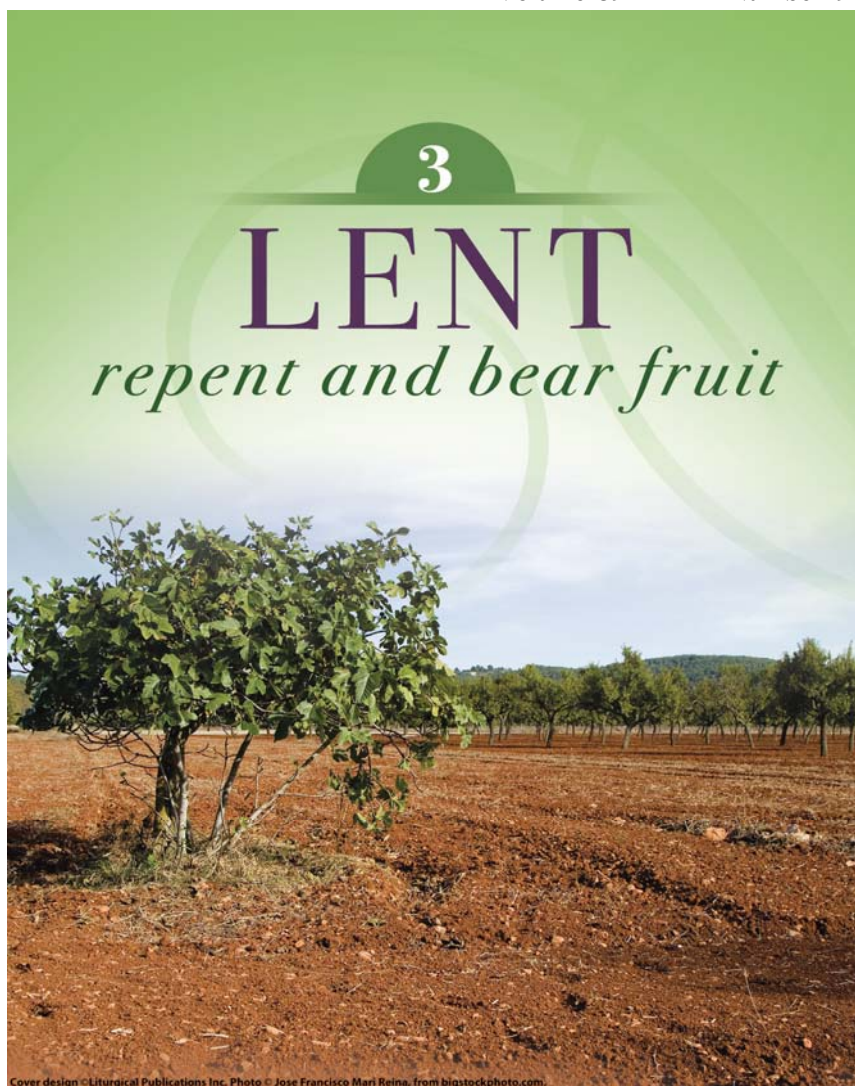

Why do Catholics have to pay to have a Mass said for their intentions?

The mass stipend, \$5.00 in our diocese, is a voluntary offering given to the church. In return a mass will be said for their specific intention. This can be for the benefit of a person living or dead or for the specific intention of the donor. The practice of the laity bringing an offering goes back to our Jewish roots when people would bring or buy an animal for the sacrifice. Since Jesus won our salvation once and for all with His sacrifice on the cross, animal sacrifices are no longer needed. Early Christians would celebrate the Eucharist at Sunday assemblies and they would often bring offerings of bread and wine that would be used for the service or other food or gifts with the excess going to feed the poor or support the clergy. By the 7th and 8th centuries the custom began to bring monetary offerings, much like we do today when we take up a collection at mass. Mass stipends generally do not go directly to the priest but go into the general fund to support the church or in some cases to the foreign missions if that is the request. All of our offerings at Mass are meant to give us a way to fully participate in Christ's sacrifice that we celebrate in the Eucharist.

CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: TIME OF PURIFICATION

As we celebrate this **Third Sunday of Lent**, the Gospel at most of the Liturgies will speak of the need for repentance and bearing good fruit, while at the 9:00 Eucharist, the Gospel will recount the meeting of Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well. The Scriptures at the 9:00 Eucharist will be different this year because they speak to us all, but in a special way to the Elect and Candidates for Full Communion who will have the First Scrutiny during the Liturgy of the Word. The idea of a Scrutiny does not mean we are “looking them over” or they are “looking us over” before joining our journey. It simply means that they are being encouraged to look at their lives, to see how they can best prepare for the Easter Sacraments. The woman at the well spoke with Jesus, and they are being encouraged to speak with him also, that he might help them prepare for Easter. It is beautiful to have the Elect and Candidates journeying with us, as they remind us of the need to scrutinize our own lives and grow through this graced season to Easter.



The photograph above was taken at the Cathedral when our Catechumens and Candidates went to the Cathedral for the Rites of Election, celebrating their being called and chosen for Full Communion with the Catholic Church. They are a wonderful group of people I have gotten to know a bit better over these months, and numbers also can't say what a great group they are, but basically we will have at the Easter Vigil five unbaptized adults seeking Baptism; thirteen unbaptized youth seeking Baptism; seven baptized adults seeking Full Communion with us; and twenty baptized youth seeking Full Communion with us. You received the name of one of them in your Lenten packets and we have their photographs and names posted in the foyer of the church for your information.

I received an e-mail from friends in France about finding a home for a sixteen year old girl who wishes to come to Baton Rouge/Denham Springs for four weeks in July.

Her name is Sixtine and she is photographed at left with her parents and little brother, Jules. She would like to come and live here with a family and take part in many of the activities our youth participate in during the summer months. **Anyone wishing more information could contact me (665-5359) and I can put you in touch with them if you would like.** The



parents have offered to welcome the student(s) in the family where Sixtine would be going before she would come in July if they would like.

The Abbey Youth Festival will be March 12, and this Tuesday, March 1 is the deadline for on-line and pre-registration. Registration costs are \$40, which includes the Abbey Youth Festival T-Shirt. These have always been good and enjoyable outings for our youth and I would like to encourage any who have not registered yet to do so. Youth come from all over the state and it is a really nice day of music, talks, prayer and fun. Contact Kevin Acord if you have any questions or wish to register through him and our parish youth ministry.

I know you have seen the posters, flyers and read about it in the bulletin, but I would encourage you to attend our parish mission the week of March 14. Dr. D'Ambrosio will speak at all Liturgies the weekend of March 12/13, and will offer the Mission Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 7:00 p.m.

The response to Pope Francis's invitation to give and receive mercy in many ways has been well received. One thing he mentions back in November was a simpler Tribunal process for annulments. It looks like it will be both simpler and quicker and many are responding. Last year in January our Tribunal had received about 25 cases, and this year within about the same timeframe, we had received over 50 petitions. I know I have helped many couples submit cases these past weeks, and I am grateful to be able to assist.

This Tuesday I will be ordained 47 years. I never saw myself being ordained 47 years, but it's happened and I'm glad it's happening here with you. You are a real delight to live, pray, and minister to and with. Have a good week. Love,

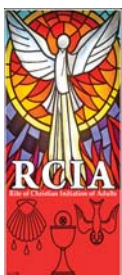

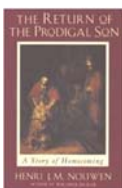

The Third Phase of the Catechumenate...Purification and Enlightenment—This Third Sunday of Lent we, the assembly, celebrate with our Elect the first of three Rites of Scrutiny which includes prayers for the strength to be faithful to the gospel and deliverance from evil. The Elect will bow in humility as the priest and our community pray for them. The Rites of Scrutiny are meant to uncover and then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the elects' hearts and to bring out through repentance all that is upright, strong and good. Three Scrutinies are celebrated in the parish community on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, after the Homily. The Scripture readings for the Scrutinies come from Cycle A of the Lectionary: the Gospel story of the Samaritan woman at the well for the 1st Scrutiny, the Gospel story of the healing of the man born blind for the 2nd Scrutiny, and the Gospel story of the raising of Lazarus for the 3rd Scrutiny. The celebrations of the Scrutinies also remind the whole parish community of the need to reflect on our own sins and the need for God's help. Use this group of readings as Lenten reflections, asking the Lord to give you the grace to hear what is being said to you.
