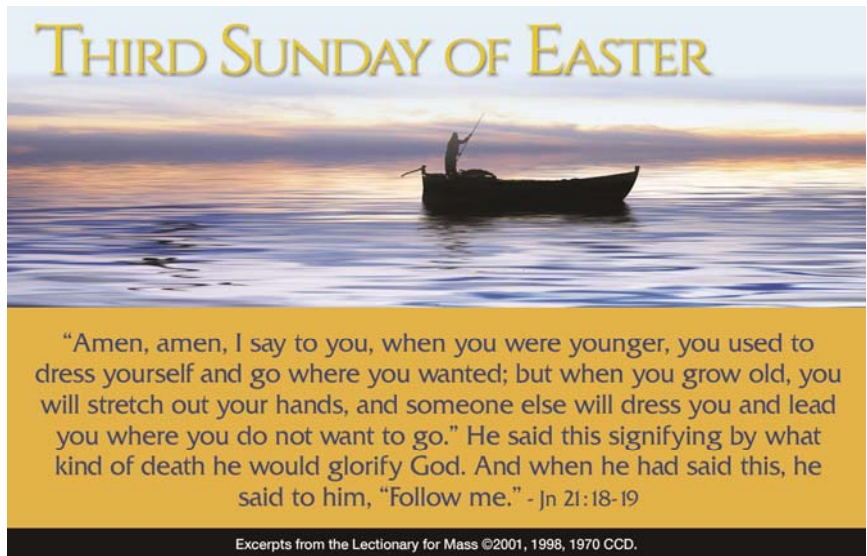

CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: EASTER OBEDIENCE

As we continue through this Easter Season we have the beautiful Easter scene this Sunday of Jesus speaking directly to Peter. Jesus calls Peter to follow him and to feed his sheep. Jesus expresses his love and confidence in Peter which overcomes the guilt Peter must have felt after denying him three times. All of us have memories that like Peter's cause regret, but the Lord still reaches out lovingly to us, calling us to obedient faith.

Culture today tends to ignore the virtue of obedience. Our heroes often are those who don't do what they are expected to do, and obedience is associated with weakness and fear. It is true that false obedience can make us weak. Some are obedient to their feelings, to television or their own appetites. I guess it comes down to whom or what we are obedient to. Being obedient to God and to his will makes us strong and helps us grow in faith and love. St. Jean Vianney, patron of parish priests, once wrote that obedience "gives us the power to conquer self, to overcome laziness, and to resist temptations. It inspires us with courage to accomplish even the most difficult tasks."

Obedience to God can be liberating and empowering. Once free to obey the will of God, we are free to pursue our mission in life and become the best version of ourselves.

As we neared the Easter Triduum, the priests, deacons and many parishioners from throughout the Diocese joined Bishop Muench for the Mass of the Holy Chrism. At this special Eucharist, the priests renewed their commitment of service to the parishioners of the Diocese of Baton Rouge and the Bishop blessed the oils that would be used in parishes throughout the Diocese until next Easter. Participating in this special Eucharist were

Sandra Bauder, Judy Graphia and Toni Matthews. Sandra brought the large urn with the Oil of the Catechumens for the Bishop to bless, and Toni, accompanied by Judy, picked up the oils for the parish at the end of Mass. They were carried in procession with the gifts for the Eucharist here on Holy Thursday, used at the Easter Vigil Holy Saturday, and will be used throughout the year.

A lot of what we are speaking of this Third Week of Easter happened as we began the celebration of Easter. I would like to call your attention to something happening on Pentecost, the end of the Easter Season – The Grill Is On for You! On May 15 we celebrate the end of the Easter Season with the celebration of Pentecost – the Birthday of the Church. The staff thought this would be a very appropriate day to have The Grill Is On for You again and invite the whole parish family together to celebrate the Birthday of the Church – a big birthday party complete with hamburgers, hot dogs, trimmings, etc. and, of course, a big birthday cake. Our first Grill Is On for You was a great success, and we had a wonderful turnout of parishioners that Sunday afternoon. It was our first time, and since then, we have tried to work out some of the kinks and, hopefully, it will be bigger and better than the first one, though it was fantastic. It was wonderful seeing the large crowd of parishioners (over sixteen hundred!) coming for fellowship after the 11:00 Eucharist. When I left the church after Mass, I couldn't believe the line. It was wonderful to see! Like last year, it is all free, and simply an occasion to come together and thank God and one another for the blessings of our parish family. We thought Pentecost, when the Church received life through the gift of the Holy Spirit was the ideal day to do this. **Please reserve the date. More will be following in the coming weeks.**

Speaking of upcoming events, I just wanted to remind Fathers of the upcoming Father/Daughter Dance this Friday, the 15th at 6:00 p.m. A flyer was in last week's bulletin with all the information about the gathering which will benefit the Early Learning Center this year. As we continue through the Easter Season, let us keep one another in prayer that this wonderful season will remain with us throughout the year. Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

We have reached the 4th period of the RCIA process which is the neophyte year. All who were baptized and received into full communion are called neophytes in this period. The final period of regular weekly formation extends through the Easter season, the seven weeks from Easter to Pentecost. This post-baptismal catechesis is called Mystagogy. It is a time for deepening the Christian experience, especially in appreciation for the sacramental life, for spiritual growth, and for entering more fully into the life and unity of the Catholic community. The neophytes now share with Christ, and his Body in the parish community, the intimate communion for the Eucharist. Now they have access to all the means of sanctification. We as a parish community pledge to help them grow and mature in the Christian life and to develop a genuine Catholic world view. Please pray for all those who God has called to join us as we continue on our pilgrimage to our Father in Heaven.
