

**St. Vincent de Paul News:** Due to the flooding of our facility in Denham Springs, we are not able to provide the Holiday Gift Basket/Toy Drive Program this year.

The Status of the Church: Any sheetrock in the church that got wet has been removed. The perimeter walls of the church are cement blocks covered with plaster which does not absorb water like sheetrock and so does not need to be removed. We spent 5 days drying out the church and the walls have tested out dry. The water did not reach the cushion/seat part of the pews and they have all tested out dry. We have removed all the kneelers in the church and have ordered new parts for the pews (the legs) that got wet and they are being made now and should be replaced by the end of October or first of November. We have had the church inspected and approved by an environmental expert from the diocese. We should begin painting the walls that had to be replaced this week. I hope this eases your concerns and we will see you and your family in church with us soon. I hope this has been of some help; if you have further questions please contact me.

#### CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: ORDINARY TIME NEEDS

The Scriptures today speak of gratitude, recognizing




what the Lord is trying to do for and with us. While the Gospel today speaks of the leper who returned giving thanks and praising God, I would like to also refer to another incident that happened when Jesus supplied the needs of others and there was a spirit of gratitude and thanksgiving.

All the Gospels speak of Jesus feeding a large crowd, taking care of their needs, but in John's Gospel, Jesus asks the disciples where they can get food for the people. The

response of the disciples is simple – they do not have enough

money to buy food for all of these people, and besides, where would they get the food even if they had the money. Then Jesus asks what they have and the response is again, simple and direct - five loaves and two fish. Then Jesus takes what they have, gives thanks, and then gives it to the people to eat through the hands of his disciples. Everyone eats their fill and then the



leftovers are picked up and they amount to more than they had in the beginning.

This story speaks powerfully to disciples of Jesus today, to you and me, who often find themselves in ministry situations exactly like this one. Service to others often leaves us feeling like Jesus' disciples: there are so many people, so many needs, and so many things to get done. How can we minister to these people and how can we take care of these needs? Perhaps many of us have felt this way these past two months. We see challenges in our community, in our homes, in our parish which need to be addressed, but seems so much larger than anything we could personally handle. What does Jesus say to us today?

We may end up like those first disciples saying we don't have what it takes to minister. So Jesus asks, as he did in the Gospel, "what do you have?" First, it is always good to realize that some problems we tackle are bigger than us and that we cannot handle them on our own or even if we got a number of persons to help us. We just do not have what it takes to solve the problem. On the other hand, Jesus wants to know what we DO HAVE, and it is good for us to answer that question also. We give what little we have into the hands of Jesus and he blesses it, gives thanks for it, multiplies it, and then gives it back to us. And miraculous things begin to happen! People get ministered to, communities rebuild and change, the downtrodden are lifted up – all eat their fill and are satisfied.

I know I have said this before in homilies, but sometimes for one reason or another, I either got to bed late, had to get up in the night to go to the hospital or for one reason or another woke up realizing I had very little sleep and had a big day ahead of me. It is pretty much habitual now that when that happens, I ask God to pick up my slack, that I will do the best I can but have little physical resources and will really need him to fill the gap. I know I should do this all the time, not just sometimes, but there are days I am more aware than usual of what I lack. Oftentimes on my way to the hospital or a home where someone is dying, I turn off the radio in the car and pray that the Lord would give me what I need to minister to those to whom I am being sent. Jesus always seems to take what we have, blesses and multiplies it, and people are helped. May we always, but especially at this time of rebuilding, offer to Jesus what we have, trust him to do something with it, and be prepared for miracles.

Our Parish School of Religion resumes this weekend/week, and I thank all the students, parents, teachers and staff who are coming together to make this work for the good of our younger parishioners. RCIA began a few weeks ago, our PSR resumes this week, and hopefully in the coming weeks, we will see more and more of our parish ministries resuming.

As I write this, the large hall, kitchen, storage area and small hall in the Administration Building are painted. The T-buildings where ELC will resume are moving ahead, work continues on work in the Youth Building, and all the sheet rock has been installed and work begun on floating it in the Adoration Chapel. Work continues to move ahead, and hopefully, we will be returning to a lot of familiar locations toward the end of this month.

Let us pray with and for all those who have come to our aid in these past months. Let us pray for all those who have big challenges ahead of them. Let us keep one another in prayer. Love,

The celebration of the Sacraments of Christian Initiation (April 15, 2017); and 4). Mystagogia (April 23, 2017—May 21, 2017).

The Inquiry sessions are going on now and will end with the first Rite, The Rite of Welcome/Acceptance on November 27. At this time, the Inquirers will be assigned a sponsor who will journey with them and be their companion.

I remember when I was young my mother would make sure I wrote thank-you notes to anyone and everyone I could. I would write a thank-you note for a gift at Christmas. I would write a thank-you note for the gift of

time to a teacher or guidance counselor. I didn't mind writing them. It just seemed to me that she put so much pressure on me and made it seem they were the most important acts in the world.

When I was then older, I realized that not everyone wrote thank-you notes. In fact, many people don't even offer a word of gratitude to your face while you are in the act of helping them! My assumption when I was a child that everyone understood the importance of gratitude was just that: an assumption, and an incorrect one.

We can often assume that in today's world this lack of thankfulness is even more profound than in the past. But Jesus healed ten lepers and only one felt the need to return and offer thanks, and he was a Samaritan, a foreigner and societal outsider to the Jewish Jesus. But this one man, due to his movement of thanksgiving and faith, received something much more than a cure for an illness of the body. He received the salvation of his soul.

As good everyday stewards, we are called to be grateful in all things. Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians, "In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus" (5:18). It is not so much that gratitude changes anything, but it is who we are as Christians. It is God's will for us to truly become living examples of the transforming power of thanksgiving, whether we have our mother telling us to give thanks or not.
